Matthew Wallace Napa Valley, California

Matthew Wallace's Hardin Ranch Vineyard sits in a remote corner of Napa Valley, tucked into the flats of Pope Valley. Warm days and sharply cooler nights shape this far-eastern site. Though its loamy soils naturally favor Cabernet Sauvignon, Matt Hardin—owner of Matthew Wallace Wines—chose instead to craft a Sauvignon Blanc that blends California brightness with Bordeaux-style texture and depth.

A seventh-generation vineyard manager, Hardin comes from one of Napa Valley's pioneering families. Through Hardin Vineyard Management, he oversees some of the region's most sought-after sites with a firm commitment to sustainable farming. Matthew Wallace Wines debuted in 2012, with vineyards personally overseen and planned by Hardin from the ground up. He and winemaker Thomas Brown walk each site and make harvest decisions by taste, row by row. Their connection to the land runs deep, and it shows in every drop.

Hilary's Note: "What I liked most about this wine was its restraint. It is elegant without being showy although it has every right to be. I believe this version of a Sauvignon Blanc shows much of what this grape is capable of and the beauty it holds with a combination of place, person, and climate."

Kir-Yianni Macedonia, Greece

Kir-Yianni was founded in 1997 by Yiannis Boutaris, a leading figure in Greek wine. After leaving the historic Boutari Wine Group—established in 1879 by his grandfather—he built his own estate. Yiannis had already planted 40 hectares of Xinomavro in 1970, followed by 20 hectares of white varieties 15 years later. By 1997, the first Kir-Yianni vintage was fully vinified in the new winery.

Kir-Yianni is known for producing premium Xinomavro in Northwestern Greece. The name Xinomavro translates to 'Acid and Black' and is one of the world's rarest noble red varieties of the area. While you can make comparisons between Xinomavro and Nebbiolo or Pinot Noir, its character can really only be described as unique. Wines from Xinomavro are very age worthy and demand attention. The philosophy of Kir-Yianni is a respect for tradition, desire to innovate, and knowledge of the wine from grape to consumer.

Hilary's Note: "This is now our second Greek wine of the Club and it does not disappoint. I've been a fan of Xinomavro for a few years now and while this is a blend with 50% of the makeup Xinomavro, I feel this wine shows the complexity and richness of this unique grape."

WINES OF THE MOMENT

Hardin Ranch Sauvignon Blanc

This wine is 100% Sauvignon Blanc from the Napa Valley AVA. Ample sunlight brings out the variety's signature vibrancy, while cool nights help preserve its bright acidity. It shows plenty of character yet remains crisp and clean on the palate.



On the nose, this wine offers jasmine, honeydew, and grapefruit, while the palate brings lychee, orange oil, and honeysuckle. The fruit leaps from the glass yet stays restrained on the palate, leading to a lean, textured body with precise balance.

Perfect Pairings: The wine's citrus and floral lift makes it a natural match for herb-driven dishes and seafood. Try it with seared scallops and grilled artichokes with a squeeze of lemon. For something richer, pair it with a creamy risotto with peas and asparagus, where the wine's texture really shines.

The Fallen Oak

This blend of 50% Xinomavro, 30% Merlot, and 20% Syrah is made from the estate's best fruit. The grapes are handpicked, sorted, destemmed, and transferred to tanks unbroken, with each variety vinified separately at controlled temperatures.



The wine ages 12 months in oak, followed by 6 months in bottle before release. You'll find concentrated red-fruit aromas alongside cocoa, coffee, bread crust, and vanilla on both the nose and palate. Discreet tannins and balanced acidity elevate the wine's profile, leading to a long, spicy finish.

Perfect Pairings: This wine is remarkably versatile at the table. It pairs beautifully with red meat, hearty dishes, and rich, creamy sauces. Try it with beef ragu or braised lamb with tomatoes and herbs, or go Greek with moussaka to honor its roots.
