

Welcome to the Cashmere Technical 8th Grade Mini World Cup.

The Mini World Cup will be contested via 6 x 8-minute games. The fourteen 8th Grade teams have been split randomly into 2 pools of 7 teams. Each team plays 6 games in their pool to determine the top team of each pool. Goal difference will be kept, but a team can only win or lose by 6 goals. The goal difference is capped to +6 per game. The top two teams from each pool will contest in the Final

Teams scheduled for the BYE will just play a friendly against the other BYE team. The score of this game will not go towards the table. Points will be awarded as follows: 3 points for a win, 1 for a draw, 0 for a loss and two if you have the bye.

Each team will be given 6 score cards and at the end of each game a parent representative (not the coach!) will need to come and inform Lyle of the scores. He will be located in front of the pavilion with a laptop

First games will kick off at **10:40** am sharp. We will be playing across the Junior Pitches which are the pitches that you normally play your matches on. Please ask your teams to arrive at 10:20am for a light warm up so that they are ready to start at 10:40am.

The Mini World Cup Final will take place right in front of the Centennial Park Pavilion on pitch 6A

The other teams' players, coaches and parents are highly encouraged to stay and watch these matches, make as much noise and offer as much encouragement as possible. A trophy presentation will follow the final.

Welcome to the Cashmere Technical 9th Grade Mini World Cup.

The Mini World Cup will begin with four 8-minute group games. Following the group stage, teams will progress to the Round of 16 knockout phase. From there, eight teams will qualify for the quarterfinals, four for the semifinals, and finally, the last two teams will compete in the final.

The sixteen 9th Grade teams will be randomly divided into four pools of four. Goal difference will be recorded; however, the maximum a team can win or lose by in a single match is capped at six goals (+6 goal difference per game). Points will be awarded as follows: 3 points for a win, 1 for a draw and 0 for a loss.

Each team will be given score cards and at the end of each game a parent representative (not the coach!) will need to come and inform me of the scores. I will be located in front of the pavilion.

First games will kick off at **8.40 am sharp**. We will be on the Junior Pitches which are the six pitches. Please ask your teams to arrive at **8.20am for a light warm up so that they are ready to start at 8.40 am**. The Mini World Cup Final will take place on the pitch right in front of the Centennial Park Pavilion. Pitch 6.
