What can you do during National Only Citizens Vote Week?

SHINE THE LIGHT ON NONCITIZEN VOTING!

Call to Action: Shine the light on noncitizen voting!

- Use your access to the public and the media to bring attention to this issue.
 - Host a town hall on noncitizen voting.
 - Conduct legislative committee hearings, engage in fact-finding to learn what the interactions are (or are NOT) between the DMV and election officials
 - What are state agencies doing - if anything - to confirm citizenship status of registered voters?
 - Generate social media outreach in support of only citizens voting.
 - Use #OnlyCitizensVote
- Meet with local election officials in your district
 - Ask if they are utilizing federal databases, state DMV records or local jury duty records to confirm citizenship of registrants.
 - Ask what you, as a legislator, can do to help them ensure that only citizens are on local voter rolls.
- Issue public calls to action to your chief election official.
 - Gather information and facts about what he/she is (or is not) doing to confirm citizenship status of registrants and applicants to register to vote.



Celebrate Constitution and Citizenship Day!

September 17th is Constitution and Citizenship Day - a commemoration of the 1787 final passage of the U.S. Constitution by the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia.

- Introduce a constitutional amendment to state clearly that only citizens are eligible to vote in any election in the state.
- Review your state constitution regarding its language on citizen voting.

Call to Action: Analysis for databases and voter rolls!

- States should confirm the citizenship status of the state's voter rolls against one or more of the referenced databases.
- States should require ongoing confirmation of citizenship status of registered voters on at least a monthly basis.

Call to Action: Support the SAVE Act!

- Review current state election laws with the committee chairs and members of relevant election-related committees to determine what laws are necessary to add or amend to make sure only your state's citizens are voting in any election in your state.
- Require documentary proof of citizenship for new voter registrations in your state.
- Create a state Election Integrity Caucus or Working Group in your state delegation to work on and publicize issues such as noncitizen voting.
- Utilize the materials found at the Only Citizens Vote Coalition website and this report from U.S. House Speaker Mike Johnson to better understand and protect against noncitizen voting.
