The second reading invites us all to be strong and to do our best to overcome our difficulties, like athletes in a race.




Canonization Celebration:

to a disagreement with someone we love. Many years ago a good friend who was pushing a person in a wheelchair at his synagogue and while he was doing this he suffered a stroke. He would often cynically say to his friend "No good deed goes unpunished". I think at times we all feel that way, that life is not fair. I believe most of us have the unexpressed expectation that if we do what God wants, God should do what we want. Well, sometimes he does, and sometimes he doesn't, at least not right away. Today's Gospel called for a radical way of life that often stood in our heart is closed; IF our heart is made of stone, then stones will end up in our hands, and we will be ready to throw them at someone." Like Jesus and Jeremiah, I would rather die on my feet than live on my knees. Pope Leo XIV said, "Salvation does not come about by magic but by grace and faith."
