Take a walk through the forests at Oxley Nature Center this month and you'll be treated to an amazing variety of woodpeckers. The largest and most dramatic - the Pileated woodpecker - can be seen at all levels of the trees, from low on the trunk drumming with its beak as it carves out a new cavity to higher up making its noisy 'cuk! cuk! cuk!' call. Then flitting in and out of the branches higher up you'll see Red-headed, Red-bellied, the little Downy and Hairy woodpeckers all chattering and tapping. It's very active and noisy in the forest at this time of year, come and check it out!

The Wilson's snipe is looking for many different types of food, from insect larvae to small snails, lizards, frogs, fish and even baby birds.
