Phenology is the study of the timing of plant and animal life cycle stages. It is nature's calendar; when plants leaf out, insects emerge, and animals are born. Oxley naturalists have been recording these events since October of 1990 in our 'Red Books'. We are able to go back over the years and look at particular dates to see significant sightings. Let's look at some previous things that peaked our interest in May.

- 21 May, 1991 Definitely 3 Red-shoulder Hawk chicks in nest. All are molting to dark heads. Gar have been spawning in Coal Creek for about a week, also, carp spawning in BJ's Pond.
- 9 May, 1993 Big Flood!
- 8 May, 1994 Dickcissels in Meadowlark Prairie
- 2 May, 1996 White-crowned Sparrows moving through
- 21 May, 1997 new fawn seen on Red Fox Trail, w/doe 4:15 pm
- 1 May, 1999 Cape May Warbler & Blackpoll Warbler reported at RBV (she had seen Cape May W. before, at Cape May, NJ)
- 4 May, 1999 Bird Creek overflowed into WSA again, just a few inches over the trail, at the yucca, but scouring Yellow Warbler Trail.
- 6 May, 2000 Mama armadillo with 3 young (about $\frac{1}{2}$ her size) between boardwalk and bluff trail at Redbud.
- 22 May, 2001 Saw a mink at Blackbird Marsh 5:30 p.m. CDT. Saw pied-billed Grebe and 15 chicks 3 May, 2002 3 young woodchucks (about 6 weeks old) on hillside by library off and on all day, all 4 goslings and parents still at pond
- 30 May, 2002 Pair of Mississippi Kites flying over prairie, saw several long strands (4-5') of toad eggs in a puddle in old road. Saw lots of periodical cicadas throughout ONC. A newly born fawn was curled up by the back ramp to Red Fox Trail.
- 15 May, 2003 Large kettle of Mississippi Kites overhead Meadowlark Prairie -40-50 birds.
- 18 May, 2004 Barred Owl has been frequenting area around back deck, crawfish parts on railing, owl very visible, Marsh rabbit feeding along front ramp [on April 26 we observed male and female rabbits together, female gathering grasses for nest].
- 12 May, 2006 Saw Great Crested Flycatcher. Lots of Great Spangled Fritillaries on flowline and at marsh on thistle. Jim Thayer said their population has really increased here.
- 3 May, 2008 Crested Orchids in bloom at RBV

20 May, 2008 Discussed with Jim Thayer low # of butterflies this spring, Ice storm and flooding damage to overwintering stages?

27 May, 2010 Box turtle laying eggs nest to Bobs Trail near Green Dragon Trail May, 2011 Great Spangled Fritillaries everywhere! Periodical cicadas are back!

10 May, 2015 Mama woodchuck observed grooming young at front entrance to interpretive building 28 May, 2015 17 year cicadas have emerged.
