This is an opportunity for youngsters of ONCA member families to earn beads for walking the various trails at Oxley. Each different bead represents one of Oxley's many trails and one special bead can be earned for collecting trash. Children simply need to come to the front desk and report which trail has been hiked or present a bag of trash to receive a bead. A string is included with the first bead. There is a display in the library with more specific information. So, ONCA members: bring your children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, and even young friends to Oxley to hike the trails and collect the beautiful beads Jan has carefully selected.





Be a Pathfinder and earn a badge!

Did you know that you can take a Pathfinder Tour at Oxley? Anyone can earn a sewn-on Pathfinder Patch by taking a guided tour on Oxley's trails. Tours cost \$2 per participant and patches cost \$.75 each.

To earn this patch, pathfinders must accomplish the following: Identify 5 different plants, one of which must be poison ivy. Identify 5 different animals or signs of animals. Oxley's naturalist can teach you all of the requirements, or the participants can teach each other. Some groups use a combination of these two approaches.
