Seeing the flashes of bright yellow in the forests and spotting the Prothonotary Warbler and the other visitors who only come this time of year reminds us of the amazing journey that birds make from their winter resting spots in Mexico and South America all the way to their breeding spots in the Eastern US including some parts of Oklahoma and Texas.





This month for our Volunteer Spotlight, we are so pleased to honor Claire Harkness, who shares her gifts and time so generously at Oxley Nature Center.
