

(from the All About Nature Oxley Book Group)


Lily Pond. Four Years with a Family of Beavers, Hope Ryden

Discover a classic natural history book

Hope Ryden's loving, insightful and thrilling (yes!) book covers the four years she spends observing, nearly living with, a family of beavers on a small pond in Harriman State Park in New York state. Hope brings her skills of observation honed by her years as a nature photographer, film producer, animal activist and nature writer to bear on this species. Known for her several books on wild horses as well as our October selection "God's Dog"

this book will open your eyes to the closely knit family life of beavers thanks to Hope Ryden's willingness to bunk down behind shrubs and trees, quietly watching her family of beavers in the nighttime hours when they were active. She observed the family grow with new kits being born, learning to trim leaves and stems off of branches and dive deep in the channels of water the beavers use as their paths in and out of their lodge. She also learns how beavers listen for the sounds of water rushing through breaks in their cleverly constructed dams, discovering points that need repair and then fixing them. Reading this book, you will come away with a feeling of love and awe for this amazing species. Read
