OLD TESTAMENT PROPHECY	JESUS'S FULFILLMENT
"The Spirit of the Lord God is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor" (Isaiah 61:1-2).	Jesus said the Spirit of the Lord is upon Him in fulfillment of this prophecy (Luke 4:16-21).
"In the future he will bring honor to the way of the sea, to the land east of the Jordan, and to Galilee of the nations" (Isaiah 9:1-2).	Jesus went throughout Galilee, healing and preaching the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 4:12-17).
"Yet he himself bore our sicknesses, and he carried our pains" (Isaiah 53:4).	Jesus drove out evil spirits and healed all the sick who came to Him (Matthew 8:16-17).
"This is my servant; . . . I have put my Spirit on him; he will bring justice to the nations. He will not cry out or shout or make his voice heard in the streets" (Isaiah 42:1-4).	Jesus is the humble Servant of the Lord who sought to heal quietly and without fanfare (Matthew 12:15-21).
"Go! Say to these people: Keep listening, but do not understand; keep looking, but do not perceive . . . otherwise they might . . . turn back, and be healed" (Isaiah 6:9-10).	Jesus spoke to the people in parables so that only those with faith in Him would understand (Matthew 13:10-17, 34-35).
"Who has believed what we have heard? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?" (Isaiah 53:1).	Jesus performed many miracles, yet the Jews did not believe in Him (John 12:37-38).
"Look, your King is coming to you; he is righteous and victorious, humble and riding on a donkey" (Zechariah 9:9; cf. Isaiah 62:11).	Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey during the triumphal entry (Matthew 21:1-11).
"Those who hate me without cause are more numerous than the hairs of my head" (Psalm 69:4).	The world, both Jews and Gentiles, hated Jesus without cause and rejected Him (John 15:18-25).
"Strike the shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered" (Zechariah 13:7).	After Jesus was betrayed by Judas and arrested, the rest of His disciples scattered in fear (Matthew 26:31, 47-56).
"For dogs have surrounded me; a gang of evildoers has closed in on me; they pierced my hands and my feet . . . they cast lots for my clothing" (Psalm 22:16-18; cf. Isaiah 53:5; Zechariah 12:10).	Jesus suffered and died by crucifixion, being nailed to a cross, and the soldiers cast lots for His tunic (John 19:16-24).
"He was assigned a grave with the wicked, but he was with a rich man at his death, because he had done no violence and had not spoken deceitfully" (Isaiah 53:9).	Though Jesus was unjustly crucified as a criminal, He was buried in the unused tomb of a rich man, Joseph of Arimathea (Matthew 27:57-60).
"For you will not abandon me to Sheol; you will not allow your faithful one to see decay" (Psalm 16:10).	Jesus was raised from the dead on the third day (Luke 24:44-47; Acts 13:34-37)
