How to Use These Cards

Parents: Thank you for taking the journey of The Gospel Project® for Kids. Each card holds information to reinforce the Bible story at home, including the full-color picture used during the session. Open your Bible to the Scripture reference and review the Bible story with your kids. Collect these cards to help your kids understand the Bible chronologically.

Use the family discussion starters to prompt dialogue with your kids and make connections between the Bible story and the world around them.



Jesus Taught in Parables

Matthew 13; Mark 4; Luke 8

Bible Story Summary:

Jesus taught crowds by the Sea of Galilee using a parable about a farmer's seeds falling on different soils. The soils represent how people respond to God's Word—some ignore it, some give up, some are overcome by worries, and some receive it. Jesus explained that only those who welcome God's truth grow in faith and share the gospel.

Review Questions:

- What happened to the seeds that fell on each soil?
- How do we cultivate “good soil” in our lives?



Jesus Taught about the Kingdom

Matthew 13; Mark 4

Bible Story Summary:

Jesus taught about God's kingdom using parables about wheat and weeds, a tiny mustard seed, and yeast in dough. He explained that God will one day separate those who follow Him from those who don't. God's kingdom is priceless—like hidden treasure or a rare pearl.

Review Questions:

- What do the stories of the mustard seed and the yeast show us about faith?
- How did Jesus make a way for people to be part of God's kingdom?



Jesus Calmed a Storm

Matthew 8; Mark 4; Luke 8

Bible Story Summary:

Jesus and His disciples crossed the sea when a powerful storm struck, filling their boat. Terrified, the disciples woke Him, shouting, “Lord, save us! Don’t you care that we’re going to die?” Jesus rose and commanded the storm, “Silence! Be still!” As calm returned, He asked, “Why are you so afraid?” The disciples were amazed.

Review Questions:

- How did Jesus show His authority over creation?
- What does this story teach us about placing our trust in Jesus, even when things feel scary?



Jesus Gave Life and Healing

Matthew 9; Mark 5; Luke 8

Bible Story Summary:

Jairus asked Jesus to heal his dying daughter. On the way, a sick woman touched Jesus' robe and was healed. Jesus encouraged Jairus to believe, then raised his daughter to life. Jesus also healed two blind men and a man unable to speak, showing His compassion and power over sickness and death.

Review Questions:

- How did Jairus and the sick woman both show faith?
- How can God use difficult situations to grow our faith?



Jesus Fed a Crowd

Matthew 14; Mark 6; Luke 9; John 6

Bible Story Summary:

Jesus and His disciples left to rest, but crowds followed. Moved with compassion, He taught and healed them. When the people needed food, Jesus took a boy's five loaves and two fish and miraculously fed more than 5,000 people. Jesus taught that He is the Bread of Life who gives eternal satisfaction to all who trust in Him.

Review Questions:

- How did Jesus show compassion to the crowd?
- What did Jesus mean by calling Himself the Bread of Life?



Jesus Walked on Water

Matthew 14; Mark 6; John 6

Bible Story Summary:

The disciples were in a boat when a storm came. Jesus came to them walking on the water. They were scared until He said, “Have courage. It is Me.” Peter asked to walk on the water but began sinking when he took his eyes off Jesus. Jesus saved him, calmed the wind, and everyone worshiped Jesus as the Son of God.

Review Questions:

- Why did Peter begin sinking as he walked on water?
- Why is it important to recognize that Jesus is the Son of God?



Jesus Healed a Child and a Man

Matthew 15; Mark 7

Bible Story Summary:

A Canaanite woman asked Jesus to heal her very sick daughter. She showed great faith, and Jesus made the girl well. Later, many people brought their sick friends to Jesus. He healed them all, including a man who couldn't hear or speak. The people were amazed and praised God for all the wonderful things Jesus did.

Review Questions:

- How did the woman display her great faith?
- What do these miracles teach us about God and His character?



Jesus Raised Lazarus

John 11

Bible Story Summary:

Mary and Martha sent a message to Jesus saying their brother, Lazarus, was very sick. When Jesus arrived, Lazarus had already died, and the sisters were very sad. Jesus was deeply moved and said, "I am the resurrection and the life. At the tomb, Jesus prayed and Lazarus came back to life, showing Jesus' power over death.

Review Questions:

- Why did the sisters seek Jesus when Lazarus was sick?
- How did Jesus show love to His friends?



Jesus Healed a Blind Man

John 9

Bible Story Summary:

Jesus and His disciples met a man born blind. The disciples questioned the reason for the man's blindness. Jesus said, "No one's sin made this man blind. His blindness will show God's power." Jesus healed the man but the Pharisees questioned him relentlessly. Later, Jesus told him He is the Son of Man, and the man believed and worshiped Him.

Review Questions:

- How did the man who was healed respond to Jesus?
- How does Jesus heal spiritual blindness?



Jesus and Zacchaeus

Luke 19

Bible Story Summary:

Jesus visited Jericho, and Zacchaeus, a tax collector, climbed a tree to see Him. Jesus noticed him, told him to come down, and said He would visit his house. Zacchaeus hurried down and welcomed Jesus with joy! But the people complained. “Why would Jesus go to the house of a sinful man like that?” Jesus welcomed his changed heart and said, “salvation has come to this house today.”

Review Questions:

- How did Zacchaeus show he wanted to follow Jesus?
- Why did people object to Jesus visiting Zacchaeus?



Jesus' Triumphal Entry

Matthew 21; Mark 11; Luke 19; John 12

Bible Story Summary:

Jesus asked two disciples to bring Him a young donkey, fulfilling promises from long ago. When Jesus rode into Jerusalem, crowds spread coats and palm branches on the road and shouted, "Hosanna!" Some leaders wanted the cheering to stop, but Jesus said even rocks would cry out. The people wanted a mighty king to save them from their earthly enemies. Jesus came to save us from sin.

Review Questions:

- How was Jesus a better king than people expected?
- How can Christians honor Jesus as Savior and King?



Jesus Taught about the End of the Age

Matthew 24; Mark 13; Luke 21

Bible Story Summary:

Jesus' disciples said, "Teacher, look at these huge stones and beautiful buildings!" But Jesus told them, "One day, not one stone will be left on another." They asked, "When will this happen?" Jesus warned, "Many will pretend to be Me, and there will be troubles. But don't be afraid—keep watch, pray, and trust Me. I will return."

Review Questions:

- What did Jesus want His followers to do instead of being afraid?
- How does trusting Jesus calm our fears?



Jesus' Last Supper

Matthew 26; Mark 14; Luke 22; John 13

Bible Story Summary:

Jesus shared a special Passover meal with His disciples. He washed their feet to show them how to serve others. Jesus broke bread and shared a cup, telling them to remember Him. He said one disciple would betray Him, and Peter would deny Him. Jesus knew hard times were coming but promised to rise again.

Review Questions:

- How did Jesus show love to His friends at Passover?
- What is one important thing you want to remember about Jesus today?

The Gospel: God's Plan for Kids

God rules. God created everything and He is in charge of everything.
(Gen. 1:1; Col. 1:16–17)

We sinned. Everyone sins, or disobeys God. Our sin separates us from God.
(Rom. 3:23, 6:23)

God provided. God sent His Son, Jesus, to take the punishment we deserve.
(John 3:16)

Jesus gives. He died in our place and rose again. (Rom. 5:8; 2 Cor. 5:21)

We respond. We are saved when we turn from sin and trust in Jesus.
(Rom. 10:9–10,13)

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
