So That's How I Was Born? Robert Brooks, 1993. Ages 3-6. Nonfiction. Answers to common questions about conception & birth.

But How'd I Get In There in the First Place? Deborah Roffman. Ages 3-6.

How Babies and Families Are Made. Patricia Schaffer, 1988. Ages 3-7. Nonfiction. Simple, factual test describes how babies are made, focusing on different types of families. Addresses birth parents, step parents, adoption, and artificial insemination.

One Dad, Two Dads. Brown Dad, Blue Dad. Johnny Valentine; 1994. Ages 3-6. Fiction. Humorous books pokes fun at the notion that all dads look the same.

Daddy's Roommate. Michael Willhoite; 1991. Ages 3-6. Fiction. Picture book about child who lives part time with his dad and his dad's male partner.

Heather has Two Mommies. Leslea Newman; 1991. Ages 3-6. Fiction. A 3 year old is surprised to discover that not all children have 2 mommies as she does.

Asha's Mums. Rosamund Elwin and Michele Paulse; 1990. Ages 5-7. Fiction. A first grader describes her lesbian mothers to teachers and classmates.

How Would You Feel If Your Dad Was Gay? Anne Heron & Meredith Maran; 1994. Ages 6-12. Fiction. Explores feelings of 3 children growing up with gay parents.

Asking About Sex and Growing Up. Joanna Cole; 1988. Ages 7-11. Nonfiction. Reassuring and accurate.

What's Happening To Me? Peter Mayle; 1975. Ages 7-11. Nonfiction. Straightforward look at puberty for boys and girls. Cartoon-like illustrations.

It's a Girl Thing. Mavis Jukes; 1998. Ages 9-12. Nonfiction. Straightforward and funny. Answers questions girls wonder about – from buying a bra to sexuality.

Zach's Story. Keith Greenberg; 1996. Ages 8-12. Nonfiction. Essay with photos written by an 11-year-old whose parents are lesbian.

Are You There God, It's Me, Margaret. Judy Blume; 1991. Ages 10-14. Fiction. A 12-year-old thinks about boys, bras, God and her first period.

Space Station 7th Grade. Jerry Spinelli, 1991. Ages 10-14. Fiction. A 7th grade boy describes adjustment to Jr. High, first love, gym class shower. Hilarious.

Then Again, Maybe I Won't. Judy Blume, 1986. Ages 12-15. Fiction. A 12-year-old worries about his fascination with sex and changes in his body.

Twelve Days in August. Liza Letchum Murrow; 1993. Ages 12-16. Fiction. A gripping novel about ethical choices by a 16-year-old soccer star. Issues of friendship, racism and homophobia.

Two Teenagers in Twenty. Ann Heron; 1995. Ages 13-16. Nonfiction. Series of essays by gay and lesbian teenagers.

Hearing Us Out. Roger Sutton; 1997. Ages 13-18. Nonfiction. Essays by gay and lesbian teenagers and adults describe difficulties and successes of being gay and confronting homophobia in school, job, and family.
