How Can Mold Affect People?

Mold releases microscopic spores and fragments into the air. When inhaled, these particles can cause health issues in several ways:

- **As Allergens:** For many, mold spores act as allergens, triggering an immune response similar to pollen or pet dander. This is the most common reaction to mold.
- **As Irritants:** Mold also produces microbial volatile organic compounds (MVOCs), which create that tell-tale musty odor. These and other particles can irritate the eyes, nose, throat, and lungs, even in non-allergic individuals.
- **Through Mycotoxins:** Certain molds can produce toxic substances called mycotoxins under specific, very wet conditions. While the term "toxic mold" is often used, it's the conditions of heavy, long-term growth—not the mold's color—that increase risk.

It's important to remember that everyone reacts differently. One person might experience significant symptoms while another in the same home feels perfectly fine. Your individual sensitivity plays a large role.

Common Signs and Symptoms of Mold Exposure

Symptoms related to indoor mold are often non-specific and can mimic a common cold or seasonal allergies. A key indicator is if symptoms worsen when you are in a specific room or building and improve when you leave.

Watch for:

- Persistent stuffy or runny nose
- Frequent sneezing
- Coughing or wheezing
- Itchy, red, or watery eyes
- Skin irritation or rashes

- Headaches or fatigue
- Worsening of asthma or sinus problems

Who is at Higher Risk?

While anyone can be affected, certain groups are more vulnerable to the effects of mold:

- Infants and the elderly
- Individuals with pre-existing respiratory conditions like asthma or COPD
- People with known mold allergies
- Pregnant people
- Immune-compromised individuals (such as those undergoing chemotherapy or with autoimmune disorders)

Home Red Flags That Can Coincide with Symptoms

Your body's symptoms may be linked to environmental clues in your home. Look for:

- A persistent musty or earthy odor.
- Visible spots of discoloration on walls, ceilings, or baseboards.
- Bubbling, peeling, or cracking paint.
- Water stains on ceilings or around windows.
- Hardwood floors that are "cupping" (edges are higher than the center).
- Recurring condensation on windows or pipes.
- A history of leaks, flooding, or water damage.
- A musty smell when the HVAC system turns on.
- Indoor relative humidity that is consistently above 60%.

What to Do First: A Practical Action Plan

1. **Track Your Symptoms:** Keep a simple log of when and where symptoms occur. Do they get worse in the basement? Do they improve after you've been out of the house for a few hours?
2. **Reduce Exposure:** Isolate the affected area by closing doors. Use a HEPA air purifier as a temporary supplement to capture airborne particles. If you must enter the area, wear an N95 respirator.

3. **Address Moisture Immediately:** Find and fix the source of water. Without moisture control, any cleanup effort will fail.
4. **Dry Wet Materials:** Any items that can't be thoroughly dried within 24-48 hours should be discarded.
5. **Consider Small-Scale Cleanup:** For small areas (less than 10 sq. ft.) on non-porous surfaces like tile, you may be able to clean it yourself following proper safety guidelines.

When to See a Doctor

Consult a clinician if you experience severe or persistent symptoms, if your asthma becomes difficult to control, or if you develop a fever or chest pain. When you go, be prepared to discuss your symptoms and the conditions in your home. Bringing notes from your symptom log can be very helpful for your doctor.

When to Call a Licensed Mold Assessor

- The suspected mold area is larger than 10 square feet.
- Mold is present in multiple locations.
- You smell a strong musty odor but can't find the source.
- The issue involves your HVAC system.
- Your symptoms consistently improve when you are away from home.
