

Notes from Session


After a three-month vacation, the Session met on Tuesday, September 16 and October 21, 2025. There was a quorum with 8 members present in September and 8 present in October, plus Pastor Vinod, Moderator. Some highlights of the meetings were:

- ◆ The Session had a special meeting on July 28, 2025 to approve Pastor Vinod's contract for the coming year, which will run from August 1, 2025 December 31, 2026. It also approved vacation and sick days for the Administrative Assistant.
- Vera Day and Janet Daly attended a special Presbytery meeting on July 31 which approved a new church development in cooperation with the United Lutheran Church at Babcock Ranch.
- Christian Education and Worship Committees will host a Soup/Supper with a drama reading on Thursday, November 20, 2025.
- A brunch for the congregation was approved for Sunday, Oct 26 after worship.
- The Gathering Place will continue to be hosted by the standing committees and other groups of the church each Sunday after both worship services.
- With a new bookkeeper and Treasurer, the accounting records of the church needed to be reviewed. This was done by our Accounting firm and all was found in order.
- The Nominating Committee presented a slate of nominees for Elder and Deacons which were approved.
- ♦ Session approved Moe Morrison, Elmer Logan and Hal Copeland as new members of the Building and Grounds Committee and welcomed Scotty Robertson as the new Chairperson.
- With a price increase for the flowers for Sunday morning, the Worship Committee chair was able to negotiate a
 price of \$40 for the chancel flowers.
- Stewardship Sunday set for November 2 when pledges will be dedicated.
- ◆ The Women's Fellowship is holding a Handbag BINGO on October 28 with the diapers to go to Mision Peniel. They have donated \$100 to send Bibles overseas through the American Bible Society, which will match their donation..
- The Deacon report updated the Session on the well-being of our members.
- A motion to hold Cybersecurity classes for our congregation and open to all was approved. They will be held on Tuesday, Nov. 18 from 1-2:30pm and the same class offered again on Tuesday, November 25 from 10-11am.
- In October Janet Daly & Vera Day reported on the Fall Presbytery meeting held on Saturday, October 18 in Estero. Salaries for the Executive Presbyter and Stated Clark, and the 2026 budget of the Presbytery were approved. A new Inquirer was examined and approved. The ground-breaking for The Community Church at Babcock Ranch will be held on Sat. Oct. 25 at 11am.
- A Garden Club is being established through Presbyterian Women to enhance the Memorial Garden.
- Session approved the C. E. and Worship Committees sponsoring a soup supper & drama reading on Thursday, November 20 at 5pm open to all.
- Session approved a simple supper and video series to be held on Thursday's at 5pm in F.H. starting January 8, 2026 thru February 12, sponsored by C.E. and O/F Committees.
- Session approved a Lenten soup supper and drama reading to be held on Thursday Feb. 19 thru March 26 at 5pm in F.H. sponsored by the C.E. and Worship Committees.
- Session approved a Christmas gathering with ice cream and Christmas treats to be held on Sunday, December 14 at 3pm in F.H. followed by a Christmas carol sing-a-long in the sanctuary, sponsored by the Worship Committee.

As the weather, as well as the time, changes in the fall, the Session is busy with the work of the church and strives to bring the best worship and fellowship experiences it can to our congregation. We encourage you to bring your friends to join us and welcome our visitors at the many opportunities for fellowship at Holy Trinity.


Glenda Balentine

Mission Committee

Highlights another recipient of our funds.

Hearts and Homes for Veterans was created in March of 2013 for the purpose of supporting homeless veterans and families who find themselves without necessities of life.

It began in 2012 when Don Payton, a Vietnam combat Marine veteran, took action to help homeless veterans. Despite facing his own health challenges, Don set out with a pickup truck, determined to make a difference. What started as a grassroots effort soon grew into a formal organization, incorporated as a 501(c)(3) in 2013.

Our donations help veterans and their families by providing them with food, household items, emergency financial assistance and personal hygiene items. They also provide temporary housing and assist in finding permanent homes.

In 2024, 2471 veterans were assisted, \$228,867 food items given out from the food pantry, 1822 trips utilized by vets and 68,970 emergency services provided.
