The Holy Gospel according to Luke. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

¹³ Now on the first day of the week two disciples were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, ¹⁴ and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. ¹⁵ While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, ¹⁶ but their eyes were kept from recognizing him. ¹⁷ And he said to them, “What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?” They stood still, looking sad. ¹⁸ Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, “Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?” ¹⁹ He asked them, “What things?” They replied, “The things about Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, ²⁰ and how our chief priests and leaders handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him. ²¹ But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place. ²² Moreover, some women of our group astounded us. They were at the tomb early this morning, ²³ and when they did not find his body there they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. ²⁴ Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see him.” ²⁵ Then he said to them, “Oh, how foolish you are and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! ²⁶ Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?” ²⁷ Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures.

²⁸ As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. ²⁹ But they urged him strongly, saying, “Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over.” So he went in to stay with them. ³⁰ When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. ³¹ Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him, and he vanished from their sight. ³² They said to each other, “Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?” ³³ That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem, and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. ³⁴ They were saying, “The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!” ³⁵ Then they told what had happened on the road and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

 - ⇒ **Nursery:** For directions to our *friendly staffed Nursery*, please speak with an usher.



United in Faith: Building Bethany's Future is a comprehensive initiative to steward what God has given us into the decades ahead. This campaign synthesizes overdue facility renewal with strategic improvements that will strengthen ministry, welcome new generations, and support deeper engagement.

At its heart, this plan is guided by three commitments. The commitment we will focus on this weekend is **ENHANCING SPACES THAT WELCOME AND ENGAGE.**

Bethany's campus is often the first expression of God's love that people encounter. This plan prioritizes our sanctuary as well as improved hospitality, accessibility, and flexibility. From refreshed gathering spaces to improved signage, lighting, and traffic flow, these updates help Bethany communicate welcome, purpose, and joy to the people of Bethany, guests, and community partners alike.

A FRONT ENTRANCE THAT SUPPORTS COMMUNITY

\$2,000,000-\$2,500,000

Our North entrance is the way the majority of Sunday worshippers and community visitors enter our building. As we consider how to best care for this entrance, we will evaluate the prospect of increasing our welcoming space that will enhance community life.

A new north entry is envisioned as a more welcoming entrance along Hampden Avenue and a large gathering space where the Body of Christ will forge community.

STRENGTHENING OUR WELCOME

\$900,000-\$1,100,000

Entrances, gathering spaces, restrooms, signage, lighting, and interior finishes should all communicate welcome, warmth, and belonging— before a word is spoken.

Improvements include a new exterior sign along Hampden Avenue, interior updates in meeting spaces and high-traffic areas and anywhere there is evident deterioration. Other improvements include upgrades and repairs to flooring and restrooms, parking lot resurfacing, restriping, and safety enhancements. All told, these initiatives reflect Bethany's commitment to fostering the beauty and utility of our God-given facilities into an environment of warmth, welcome, and joy for everyone.

NOURISHING CAMPUS GROUNDS AND OUTDOOR FACILITIES

\$500,000-\$600,000

Bethany's beautiful and mature exterior landscape is ready for a refresh, and there are opportunities to reduce maintenance costs over time. Landscaping at three main entrances, the main courtyard, and the interior courtyard will be re-visioned to be more environmentally and economically sustainable, more easily maintained, and more seasonally attractive/water-wise. These projects create spiritually meaningful gathering places which foster reflection, celebration, and community life throughout our campus. These areas will also better support weddings, receptions, and pastoral care while continuing Bethany's many fun-filled events – socials, carnivals, and outdoor education and worship experiences.

BETHANY'S MEMORIAL GARDEN

\$200,000

The columbarium is a place of remembrance and prayer. With existing crypts fully utilized, this campaign will provide for maintenance of the existing columbarium and potential expansion.

THE POWER OF SACRIFICIAL GIVING
