Resources used in Value of Number Sessions




Thank you to the parents who attended the year group meetings this week – it was lovely to see so many of you. Next week we will meet with Y3, Y4 and Y5. Please be reminded that school finishes at 3:30pm everyday. It is very important that you collect your child on time. Children not collected by 3:45pm will join the after school club and parents will be charged £10.

Families who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) need to register to ensure they receive all the benefits they are entitled to. The schools will then receive pupil premium funding which will go towards supporting your child's learning, contributing to educational trips, booster classes and after-school clubs. Registering will ensure that you receive other benefits that you may be entitled to, like food vouchers during the holidays or access to the holiday activity fund.

Finally, I'd like to welcome Mr Dominic Noble and Ms Harriet Verney to our Parent Council, they will joining us as the new representatives for the reception classes this year.



Attendance and Punctuality

Attendance and Punctuality is key. All children should be in school every day. We want all our children to have 97% attendance or above. This term we will be awarding pupils with attendance badges for those who come into school every day!

Look out for the GOLD, SILVER and BRONZE badges.

If your child is unable to attend because they are unwell, please contact the school office by 8:30am to let us know. That way, we can authorise the absence. We will contact you if we have not heard from you as part of our safeguarding processes.

Punctuality is also important. Our gates are open from 8:40am for a soft start. Children can attend school from 8:40am and take part in the value of number sessions in class. School officially starts at 8:55am sharp. Any child after this time is marked as late in the register. Children who arrive after 9:25am will get an unauthorised absence, which will affect your child's attendance. Please support your children by ensuring that they arrive at school on time.

Steps to resolving concerns

There will be times when you may need a concern resolved. For clarity, we have steps to support you.

- **Step 1** The first person to contact is your child's class teacher. If the concern is not resolved satisfactorily then move on to step 2.
- **Step 2** Your child's Phase leader is the next step, depending on the phase.

EYFS (Nursery & Reception) – Ms Chalmers Middle Phase (years 1, 2 &3) - Mr Williams Upper Phase (years 4, 5 &6) - Ms Sams

If the concerned remains unresolved, move on to step 3.

Step 3 - Contact the Assistant Head Teacher – Ms Lewis

If the concern remains unresolved, move on to step 4.

Step 4 - Contact the Headteacher – Ms Chalmers
If the concern remains unresolved, move on to step
5

Step 5 - Contact Dr Maureen Okoye OBE.


