You probably have noticed that the 17 year cicadas arrived in mid-May and are expected to stick around until the end of June. We thought this would be a perfect time to remind you of some skills to keep you safe if a Cicada or any bug gets in your truck while you are driving. Cicadas are HARMLESS to humans. They do not bite or sting.

Just in case a Cicada or any other bug should get into the truck while you are driving here are a few tips to keep in mind.

Step One: Don't Panic

Panicking is usually the worst thing to do in any situation. Especially when you're driving a 80,000 lb truck at 65 mph down the highway. If you see a bug in your truck, remember to keep your hands on the wheel and your eyes on the road, no matter what! Even if there's a spider on your arm, remember that a bug bite is not as bad as a car crash.

Step Two: Slowly Pull Over

Remember to think about the traffic around you. This means not slamming on the brakes. If possible, put on your hazard lights to signal to other drivers that you are slowing down. Use your signal and pull over safely to the side of the road. From there, you can shoo the bug out of your truck, then return to your route.

Step Three: Be Prepared

If you know you are allergic to bee stings or other bug bites, then you should make sure that you have allergy medication or an Epipen in your trucks emergency kit. It's also a good idea to keep a phone charger in your truck so that you won't have a dead phone if you need to make an emergency call to 911.

In 2005 researchers at the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute (VTTI) conducted a naturalistic driving study. If you're not familiar with that kind of study, it just means they asked for volunteers, put cameras and sensors into their cars (in this study it was 100 vehicles), and then watched what people did while they drove. It turns out that an insect in your car is really dangerous; a bug in your car increases your risk of a crash by more than six times compared to an attentive driver (without any insects in the car).

Proper Lifting

Improper lifting is a common cause of serious back injuries and could potentially lead to a lifetime of discomfort. Also, injuries caused by improper lifting could cost you in terms of lost wages, out-of-pocket medical expenses, and your ability to enjoy the people and activities you love. Read the information below, and ask yourself if there are actions you can take to improve your lifting technique.

RECOGNIZE THE HAZARDS

PERSONAL BEHAVIORS



Most lifting injuries occur as a result of bad judgment or improper technique. A common error is rushing to lift an object without sizing up a load first to determine if you are capable of lifting the object alone. Likewise, failing to stretch your back, legs, arms, and shoulders beforehand can lead to muscle strains. Improper technique includes lifting with your back instead of your legs, making twisting movements to change direction, failing to use available personal protective equipment, or simply not asking for help.




PRE-EXISTING CONDITIONS

A person is at higher risk of injury if he or she has a pre-existing condition, such as a previous back injury, degenerative disc disorder, or obesity.

PRE-LIFTING CHECKLIST

- Know your limits, especially if you have a pre-existing condition.
- Size up the load and ask for help, if needed.
- Warm up your back, legs, shoulders, and arms with simple stretching exercises.
- Use material handling equipment, if needed.
- Wear personal protective equipment including gloves, proper footwear, back support harness, etc.
- Locate where an object is going and ensure there is a clear path and room to set it down safely.

ITDS Driver Challenge

We challenge ITDS drivers to keep our cost of repairs lower than in previous years



OR



Win a brand new car or \$25,000 cash!!

- If the entire fleet can keep our repairs under \$400,000 for the 2025 calendar year, ITDS will give away a brand new car (including taxes) or a prize of **\$25,000** cash!!
- If the entire fleet repairs are above \$400,000 but below \$450,000, ITDS will give away a prize of **\$15,000**!
- If the fleet repairs are above \$450,000 but below \$500,000, ITDS will give away a prize of **\$10,000**!
- ALL damage/repairs to ITDS equipment is included along with any damage to other personal property. (EX: tractors, trailers, tires, mud flaps, cars, buildings, powerlines, guardrails, etc.)

HOW TO QUALIFY

- All employed drivers working a full quarter and qualify for a quarterly safety bonus entered a drawing for
- Drivers employed for a full quarter with no damage will be entered into the annual drawing for that quarter. Drivers employed the entire calendar year will have the opportunity to be entered into the
- Eligibility is determined by quarterly Safety bonus's that have been given. Receiving a Safety bonus in a quarter earns on entry into the drawing. Up to four entries per year.
- To claim a prize, an employee must be an "Employee in Good Standing" at the time his or her name is drawn and at the time the prize is awarded. "Good Standing" means an active ITDS employee with no disciplinary action pending or in effect. "Employee in Good Standing" on a given date means an employee of ITDS who has not tendered oral or written notice of intent to resign or retire effective as of a date on or before the given date and has not behaved in a manner that would be grounds for termination for cause.
- Proposed ·To ensure a random and unbiased drawing, all names will be entered into digital name drawing generator to select a winner. The first name drawn of an ITDS employee in good standing will be determined the winner.
- The winner will be notified by phone.

ITDS Car Challenge (Update)

We are almost to the half way point in our damage expenses for the year. Through May our total damage is \$182,953.

This means we need to keep the month of June damage dollars below \$18,000 and we will be half way home to give a car away this year.

In 2024 our total at the end of June was \$259,110. If we do a good job in June of 2025 we can beat last years half way total by \$60,000.

Half of the \$182,953 of damage for 2025 is made up of three accidents. This means we definitely stay under \$200,000 damage for the 2nd half of the year with a concentrated effort.

We need to be focused when driving.

Make sure the cell phones are down and eyes are on the road.
