### Caring for Youth at The Ark

This year, the Ark Shelter witnessed remarkable acts of kindness:

- **A new microwave** was provided through a significant discount and support from ABC Warehouse, helping ensure meals and daily life at the shelter are a little easier for our youth.
- **Westwood Church** donated 10 handmade fleece blankets, offering warmth and comfort during the winter months.
- **Several community members** stepped forward to volunteer at the Ark, assisting staff in organizing and improving the donation room.

## Supporting Young Adults in the YIL Program

Your generosity helped transform new living spaces into homes for young adults in our Youth Independent Living (YIL) program:

- **St. Monica, St. Augustine, and Blessed Sacrament parishes** (Allegan) donated furnishings, appliances, and essential household items to fully prepare four new YIL apartments for residents transitioning to independence.
- Parishioners across the diocese contributed **personal furniture and household donations** to furnish a newly acquired **five-bedroom YIL home**, creating a safe and welcoming environment for the young adults who will live there.



## Holiday Basket Program: A Season of Abundance

Through the collective generosity of our parishes and donors, our Holiday Basket Program provided joy, stability, and hope to families in need during the Christmas season:

**St. Ann's Giving Tree** supported **11 families** with Christmas gifts and essential items.

**St. Augustine's Giving Tree** sponsored **5 families** and additionally **raised \$655** in Lowe's gift cards, which will directly support the purchase of a new stand-up freezer for the Ark Shelter.

Across the diocese, **46 client families** were sponsored by compassionate individuals, parish groups, and organizations who ensured each family received meaningful gifts, winter necessities, and household goods.

Supporters also contributed **\$3,200 in monetary donations**, helping fill gaps and extend our reach.

And on December 9th, **nine dedicated volunteers** gave their time to collect, organize, and distribute holiday baskets with care and joy.



Thank you to the many **Knights of Columbus Councils**, **St. Catherine's Right-to-Life group**, **St. Tom's Ladies group**, **St. A's youth**, and the many parishes that participated in the Caring Network Playpen Event in support of the hundreds of pregnant and parenting families that Caring Network supports throughout the year.



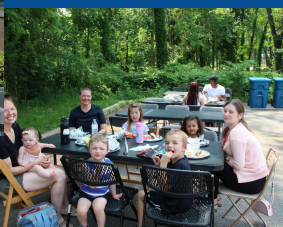
An abundance of food donations were received to benefit clients at the Catholic Community Center in Benton Harbor and the Bread of Life food program.

## Home Heating Assistance Program - 2026

The Catholic Charities Home Heating Assistance Program began on January 5th. Our program provides emergency heating assistance (up to \$300 per household), to anyone in need residing within the nine counties of the Diocese of Kalamazoo which includes: Allegan, Barry, Berrien, Branch, Calhoun, Cass, Kalamazoo, St. Joseph and Van Buren Counties. Donations contributed to the Heating Assistance Fund are for “emergency” heating needs only. The program will run until March 30, 2025, or when our funds are gone.

### Did you know?

- Over 583,000 Michigan households were more than 30 days past due on utility bills last December.
- 40% of these were low-income or senior households.
- In 2025, the Home Heating Program aided 261 households.
- Since 1982, this program has aided 14,400 households with over \$2,485,000 in utility assistance.
