

## STEWARDSHIP REPORT — JON CISAR



The Stewardship Taskforce met Aug.6 in person with our GSB consultant. We touched base on the successes of last year's pledge drive and also looked at what we could do better this year. Last year, we exceeded both our goals: number of pledges collected and the dollar amount pledged over the previous year.

This year we are looking to keep the same three focuses of: Christ centered worship, engaging the community, and welcoming more families to worship. We hope to communicate how we've made progress on these focuses and will continue

to tell personal stories of how this church is improving and/or enriching lives.

The council has been tasked with thinking about tactics to engage our three focus areas. And also, if we are looking to bolster our staff (office help, 2nd pastor, part-time pastor, etc) what should that look like?

The Stewardship Taskforce met on Aug. 18th at 6pm via Zoom to further prepare for the imminent pledge drive and stewardship campaign. The congregation will receive more information in the near future.

## PORTRAIT OF A SPIRITUAL QUEST

AUTHOR'S NOTE: This brief profile of a members of the East Side Lutheran Church family is presented here because they are in the pews and you have noticed them. In fact, you are often aware when they are in church and when they are not because their presence shapes your sense of belonging in this faith community. This story may offer an insight, a bit of inspiration or answer a question you've wanted to ask.



In June, Philip Pranger presented a rare experience for the East Side Lutheran Church congregation. At a 10 a.m. Sunday service Phil stood in front of the church as he served as the baptismal sponsor for his wife, Kelsey, and their daughters Leiyssa, a junior at Brandon Valley High School, and Jaylen, a student at Brandon Intermediate School. When the service ended, Phil said, "I felt as if a weight had been lifted; part of my job had just gotten done."

And perhaps the event would not have happened had not Jaylen asked a big question: "Dad, can we go to church?" It was not an easy question for Phil to ignore. "I couldn't wiggle out of this one."

The family began attending a church they were familiar with. It wasn't a fit. It could have ended there but something else was at work. Phil had regularly listened to the radio station KXRB ("It's my favorite"). He had it on Sunday mornings while he tinkered in the garage. He liked the organ music and he would pause for the sermon. "The minister sounded very welcoming," Phil said.

So the Sunday morning routine had been set well before Jaylen asked to go to church. Phil's mother, who lives in the East Side neighborhood, suggested the family try East Side Lutheran. And they did just that.

It was only after the family settled in the pew that Phil made the connection: the welcoming pastor he had been listening to on the radio was the man greeting the congregation now at the start of the service: Pastor Layne Nelson. Since that Sunday, Phil and Kelsey have volunteered to do some painting around the church. Phil extended the volunteer effort by helping other church members with tasks around their house.

"Volunteering just felt right," Phil said. Yet it was the "Food to You" program that gave the Prangers another chance to volunteer as a group. "We had not done this as a whole family before." Phil also ushers on Sundays and has learned to work the sound booth.

The seed to find a place to worship had been planted a long time ago by grandparents who took Phil to church when he visited them in Platte, SD. It was there, after church, a simple gesture pointed to a future. The pastor made it a point to greet Phil after the service ended and shake his hand. "He acknowledged my presence," Phil said. The acknowledgement set the stage for something that could come next.

The request to go to church coincided with a crossroads in Phil's life; he just left a promising job with no clear idea what he would do next. Phil described it as having his back to the wall.

Phil has found another job. He's a school bus driver for the district that provided him with his grade and high school education. After the first few days on the job Phil has found his military experience has been helpful to wrangling a big bus and a bunch of kids in the morning and afternoon. "I haven't felt like this (exhausted) since I was a private in the army," the former infantry squad leader said."

We are grateful the Pranger's have joined our East Side Lutheran Family.

### COUNCIL MINUTES — PASTOR MICHAEL MOLLAND



East Side Lutheran Congregation Council Meeting August 17, 2025

Present: Ray Schut, Jon Cisar, Danielle Champa, Brian Ensberg, Todd Brower, Carla Middlen, Brenda Schut, Gwen Oakland, Michael Molland, and Pastor Layne Nelson.

President Ray Schut called the meeting to order at 11:15.

Opening Devotions – Pastor Layne Nelson opened the meeting with devotions.

Secretary's Report: Brian Ensberg moved; Carla Middlen seconded to approve the minutes from the July 13, 2025 Council Meeting. Motion Carried.

President's Report: President Schut reported on the rejuvenation of the West Classroom and upper level classroom. He discussed our participation in the LifeLight event and our need for volunteers. The council discussed the dramatic increase in homeless people spending daytimes and sometime overnight on church property.

Pastors' Report: Pastor Layne Nelson reported that President Schut has reviewed and updated our Wedding Guidelines. Pastor Nelson stated we have performed the following pastoral acts so far this summer: Six Baptisms; Five Weddings; and Eight Funerals. He reported that summer worship attendance has ranged from 194 to 290. Fall attendance is normally over 300.

Pastor Nelson presented a Sabbatical Proposal for the year 2026. The East Side personnel policy states that eight weeks are allowed after every six years of a pastors call. Pastor Nelson is now in his eighth year of call. The council reviewed the proposal.

Carla Middlen moved; Gwen Oakland seconded; that the Sabbatical Proposal for the year 2026 be approved. Motion Carried.

Financial Report: Treasurer Brian Ensberg reported that year to date as of July 31, 2025, we are \$10,745 better than budget; our net position is (\$50,357) which is normal for churches during this time of year; total offerings are up 9.9% over last year. \$29,651; and the Capital Savings Money Market balance is \$63,879 (proceeds are used for capital projects and special programs).

We have received over \$18,000 in foundation gifts that former members gifted ESLC through the Sioux Falls Community Foundation. We projected \$15,000 in the budget. Treasurer Ensberg reviewed 2025 year end forecasts with the council.

Jon Cisar moved; Carla Middlen seconded to approve the financial report for July 2025. Motion Carried.
