Welcome, December! Welcome, Advent! Welcome, Christmas!

This is the time of year when we eagerly look forward to a transcendent experience, a moment of anticipation. In December, our plans—from schedules to travel arrangements—revolve around the 24th and 25th, Christmas, a time most of us spend with family and loved ones.

We dedicate the entire month to preparing for those two special days. Whether we are recovering quickly from illness, getting the house ready for company, or baking cookies, we are all pressing toward Christmas, excited for the moment when everyone is together.

The season of Advent is a time when the Church calls us to pause, slow down, and prepare our hearts and minds for the profound, miraculous reality of God becoming human. Our tradition views Advent much like a mini-Lent: a period dedicated to self-reflection and restraint. We are urged to shift our focus from our own needs to the needs of others.

As Christmas approaches, the signs begin to subtly emerge each Sunday: a touch of green appears, and parts of the Nativity scene are unveiled. However, the celebration of Christmas is not yet upon us. While we may hear the 24-hour Christmas music stations and remember the joy of singing "Joy To The World" together at St. Peter's, we must temper that excitement. It can be tempting to abandon the Advent focus, especially when other traditions may already be singing carols, but we intentionally hold back our complete joy because it is not Christmas yet.

During this short period of waiting, we anticipate celebrating the Messiah's birth at Christmas. However, the Church also directs us to look ahead to the day of his glorious second coming. The return of Jesus Christ is the central hope of Christians. Every Sunday, we affirm our belief that his return will usher in an unending reign, fully establishing God's rule on earth as it is in heaven. It will be a time when wars cease, and everyone has plenty, with no one suffering want. The command of Jesus to love one another will be a tangible reality, leading nations to abandon conflict and the ways of war forever. Although this future may seem too wonderful to be true, by faith, Christians look forward to this certain assurance.

We are called to live faithfully until the Lord returns, primarily by following Jesus's command to love God with our whole selves, demonstrated especially in how we treat one another. Our baptismal vow commits us to working for justice and peace for all people and to respecting everyone's inherent dignity. Our chosen language is love, not hate, and our loyalty belongs solely to Jesus, not to any human or earthly movement. This way of life will be noticeable to others, who will then seek the peace we experience. By consistently practicing this spiritual discipline, we continue to advance God's Kingdom until the time of Jesus's second coming.

Be ready, Advent calls to us. Be prepared. The Messiah is on the way. So, slow down, take stock of what's important, and become the life Jesus calls us to live by loving others.

Joy is on the way! Christmas will soon be here. I am so looking forward to being with all of you on the 24th and 25th. Until then, let's prepare and get ready.

May God bless you. May you have a blessed Advent and a holy Christmas season with your family at home and here at St. Peter's.
