

As we turn the calendar to February, the church enters one of its most profound and ancient seasons. While the world around us often demands that we be "more"—more productive, more successful, more connected—Lent invites us to be still, to be honest about our limitations, and to return to the heart of God.

The season of Lent spans forty days (not counting Sundays), mirroring the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness. It is a time of intentional "spiritual housecleaning." Traditionally, we observe this season through three primary pillars:

- **Prayer:** Seeking God's presence with renewed focus.
- **Fasting:** Creating physical space to recognize our spiritual hunger.
- **Almsgiving:** Practicing radical generosity toward those in need.

The journey begins on Ash Wednesday (February 18, 2026). On this day, we receive the imposition of ashes—a practice that dates back to the early Church. These ashes, usually created by burning the palm branches from the previous year's Palm Sunday, serve as symbols of: our mortality and repentance. We are reminded of the fragility of life. This isn't meant to be morbid, but rather to ground us in the reality that every breath is a gift from God. The word *repentance* literally means to "turn around." The ash cross on our foreheads is a public sign that we are turning our lives back toward God's path.

A common question during Lent is, "*What are you giving up?*" Whether it's chocolate, social media, or a habit like complaining, the goal of fasting is not to prove our willpower. Rather, it is to remove distractions. When we feel the "itch" for the thing we've given up, it serves as a physical prompt to pray. If we give up a luxury, the money saved can be redirected to a charitable organization, turning a personal sacrifice into a blessing for someone else.

Lent is not a season of "earning" God's love through our behavior. Instead, it is a season of stripping away everything that keeps us from realizing we are *already* loved beyond measure. We walk into the desert of Lent not to be alone, but to find that God has been waiting for us there all along.

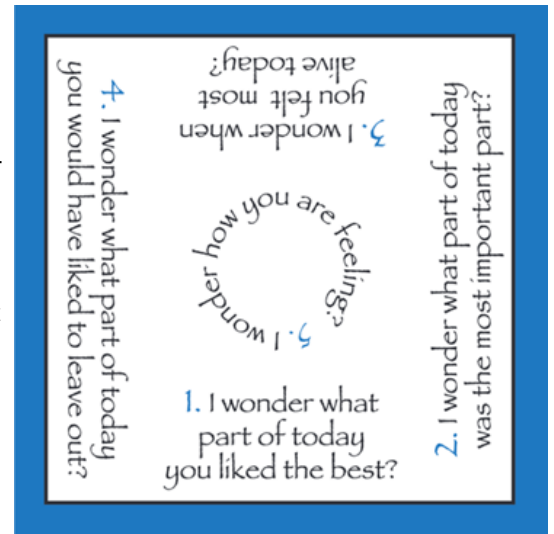
ST. PETER'S (CHILDREN & FAMILIES)

Parenting is hard, no matter how many books you read on the subject. Children surprise us at every turn. Sometimes those surprises are heartwarming, like their discovery that jumping like a frog is fun. Other surprises test our patience, such as their newfound joy in collect-

ing rocks and bugs and bringing them into the house.

As an early childhood educator, I know that the way I respond to these surprises impacts my child's self-esteem and our parent/child relationship. However, in the moment that line of thought rarely prevails. How can I do better in the moment and not collapse the lines of communication with my child forever?

I was recently introduced to the Wonder Together Project by Sally Thomas. Grounded in Godly Play philosophy, The Wonder Together Project is a set of 5 simple "I wonder" questions that support communication and connection. It is suggested to use these questions around the dinner table or another time when the family gathers. It is expected that everyone participate—children, teens, and adults. It is in the joint sharing that the moments of connection occur.



The other take away I received by learning about this project was the phrase, "I wonder...". So many times as a parent (and teacher) the first words that come to mind are "What were you thinking?" I can tell you, the child wasn't thinking and simply following an experience. Asking that question out loud will not result in productive dialogue. However, verbalizing "I wonder how that made you feel?" or something similar, diffuses the tension and results in a more productive discussion of lessons learned and opportunities for change. Give it a try. (It works for adults, too.)



During the season of Epiphany, we will be collecting diapers (all sizes) and wipes. Bringing gifts for the Christ Child to help the children in our community.
