

As the calendar turns to January, the festive glow of Christmas morning begins to fade, and the decorations return to their boxes. However, in the life of the church, we are just beginning a season of profound discovery: **Epiphany**.

The word *Epiphany* comes from the Greek *epiphaneia*, meaning "manifestation" or "striking appearance." It marks the moment when the light of Christ was revealed not just to a small village in Judea, but to the entire world—represented by the arrival of the Magi.

In our modern lives, January is often a month of resolutions and fresh starts. It can also be a time of "winter blues" as the days remain short and the air grows cold. The season of Epiphany offers us a spiritual counter-narrative to the mid-winter gloom:

Seeking: Like the Wise Men, we are invited to look up from our daily distractions and notice where God is moving.

Following: Faith is rarely a static state; it is a journey. Sometimes that journey requires us to travel "by another way" than we originally planned.

Offering: The Magi brought gold, frankincense, and myrrh. This month, consider what unique gifts you are called to lay at the feet of Christ—your time, your compassion, or perhaps your renewed commitment to justice.

As we move through these coming weeks, let us be a people who don't just celebrate the light, but reflect it. May your January be filled with "Aha!" moments of grace and the quiet confidence that the Star of Bethlehem still shines for you today.

What happened which came unexpectedly but was greatly appreciated?


