It's that time of year when we turn our attention to Stewardship. At St. Peter's, stewardship is understood not just as financial giving, but as a spiritual practice. It's rooted in the belief that everything we possess—our time, talents, and financial resources—are gifts from God, to be used in service of God's mission.

Stewardship is the deliberate act of managing and utilizing these divine gifts to support the various ministries of the church and to serve the wider community. Fundamentally, it is a tangible expression of gratitude, allowing parishioners to live out their faith and actively participate in the ongoing work of the church.

The importance of stewardship at St. Peter's is seen through a holistic lens that encompasses more than just money. While financial pledges are crucial for St Peter's operational budget, they represent only one part of the equation.

Time: We encourage parishioners to dedicate their time to various ministries and volunteer opportunities. These include teaching Sunday school, serving on committees, and participating in outreach programs that address local and global needs. By volunteering, we strengthen our community, increase engagement, and directly contribute to the church's mission of service.

Talent: Individuals are called to be stewards of their unique skills and abilities, sharing these gifts to serve God and others. This creates a vibrant and multifaceted church life, where each person's specific contributions enrich the community.

Treasure: Financial giving is a vital component of stewardship. It's the primary way St Peter's funds its operations, from paying clergy and staff to maintaining its campus to its outreach initiatives. Pledging—a commitment to a specific financial gift—allows the church to create a stable and predictable budget, ensuring that its ministries can continue to flourish. This act of giving is seen not as an obligation, but as a joyful and grateful response to God's generosity.

St. Peter's relies on the essential practice of stewardship for its survival and growth. Financial contributions, especially pledges, allow us to budget for the coming year, covering everything from routine maintenance and utility costs to funding worship, music, and educational programs for all ages. Without this consistent support, the church could not provide a place for worship, spiritual formation, and community fellowship.

A strong culture of stewardship enables St. Peter's to expand its mission beyond its immediate community. The church actively supports various outreach initiatives, including serving meals to the homeless and collaborating with organizations that assist refugees and deliver humanitarian aid. This dedication to "reaching out" directly stems from the generous and faithful contributions of its members. Stewardship empowers the church to be a positive influence in the world, embodying the Christian command to love and serve our neighbors.

Ultimately, stewardship is a personal spiritual discipline, inviting individuals to deepen their relationship with God by acknowledging that everything they possess is a gift. Giving transforms into an occasion for prayerful discernment, enabling parishioners to align their priorities with God's will. This approach counters the worldly perspectives of ownership and scarcity, instead cultivating a mindset of abundance and gratitude. By consciously and intentionally sharing their time, talents, and treasure, we are not simply supporting an institution; we are engaging in a transformative journey of faith and discipleship.

Bearing Witness

A Journey with Holy Land Christians



Palestinian Christians are part of the unbroken Christian presence in the land of Jesus going back to the first church. The Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem is a vital part of this indigenous Christian community in the Holy Land, sustaining 27 parishes and more than

two dozen humanitarian institutions across five countries. Through their faith, resilience and humanitarian outreach to people of all religions, ethnicities, and economic circumstances, these Palestinian Anglicans bear witness to Jesus today in a region of conflict, brokenness, and distrust. *Bearing Witness* is your opportunity to learn about the realities of life in the Holy Land today and the impact and influence of the small, dwindling Christian community who live, worship, and minister in the place where Jesus taught and healed.

In *Bearing Witness* videos, filmed on location in the Middle East, you'll hear every-day Christians, Muslims and Jews describe life in Israel and the Occupied Palestinian Territories of East Jerusalem, the West Bank and Gaza. They share their personal stories and struggles to establish a sense of belonging in a region of confounding political, religious and cultural complexity. They express their fears for the land they love and their hopes for a future where all can live together with dignity, freedom and security. St. Peter's Fall Picnic!!! Sunday, October 5th

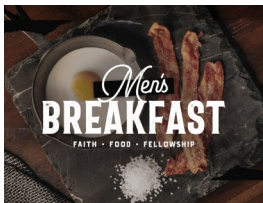
