ST. PETER'S (CHILDREN & FAMILIES)

At our Sunday School Kick-off last month, I was privileged to tell the Godly Play story of The Circle of the Church Year. It is a wonderful story that lays out how the Church tells time throughout the year. It starts with the 3 great times—Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost. Next, it talks about the getting ready times of Advent, Lent, and the Season of Easter. Finally, we spend a great deal of time talking about the great, green, growing Sundays between the great times. The story also shares the colors that the Church associates with each time. White and gold for the celebrations of Christmas and Easter, blue for Advent, purple for Lent, green for the seasons after Epiphany and Pentecost, and red for Pentecost.

After the story, we have wondering questions that make us think more deeply about the story. My favorite wondering questions from this story are :

“What color is your favorite?”

“Have you ever come close to these colors in the church?”

“Why do you think the Church tells time with colors?”

Personally, my favorite color from the story is purple. The getting ready time for me is what makes the celebration more wonderful. Each year I wonder when I have ever come close to the colors in the church. I certainly notice them a lot more after I share this story. However, I still wonder what it means to come close to them so I’m still awaiting that experience. Sharing this story makes it clear to me that the Church uses colors to help people remember what each time is about. It is so easy to move from season to season without much thought. However, when the colors change it sends a clear signal that things are different and I need to take notice.

The story of The Circle of the Church Year ends with the following: “It’s all here. Everything we need. For every beginning there is an ending, and for every ending there is a beginning. It goes on and on, forever and ever.” What a comforting and inspiring way to start our program year. We will have everything we need, and it will be full of beginnings and endings that will go on forever.
