The Pandora Village Council met in Regular Session on Tuesday, January 27, 2026 at 7:00 PM at the Municipal Building, with Mayor, Jeremy Liechty, presiding.

Members Absent: None

Also in attendance: Chief, Scott Stant /Village Administrator, Rick Morrison/ Fiscal Officer, Kimberly Reese/ Solicitor, Scott Basinger.

Guests Present: Riley Township Trustees - Brian Miller, Greg Amstutz, and Scott Meyer along with Township Fiscal Officer, Marcia Schutz and Fire Chief, Craig Fischer

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion was made by Mr. Fricke, seconded by Mr. Gray, to approve the January 13, 2026 Minutes. Voting: All Yea.

Motion was made by Mr. Gray, seconded by Mrs. Lammers, to approve the bills as presented; total non-payroll of \$73,151.79 and payroll of \$22,291.53 for a total of \$95,443.32 Voting: All Yea.

Mr. Jeff Vance was present to introduce himself to Council and ask for their support as he will be running as a Republican candidate for Putnam County Commissioner at the May primary election.

Fire Chief, Craig Fischer, presented the following information to Council; (1) The fire department had 48 calls in 2025, 36 were within the village and 10 were for providing mutual aid. (2) Equipment is in good shape. (3) There are currently 17 volunteer firemen. (4) Waiting on a grant for turnout gear and will be seeking a grant for \$50,000 for bottles. The department received a \$40,000 grant in 2025 for marcs radios. (5) There are no major expenses foreseen for 2026. (6) Restrooms at the station were redone in 2025 and they would like to redo the gear rack.

Council conducted the quarterly review of Procurement and Credit Card accounts currently held by the village as well as the listing of employees that have issued cards on these accounts. Council President, Rick Fricke, signed off on the Procurement Card account and Mayor, Jeremy Liechty, signed off on the Credit Card account.

Motion was made by Mrs. Braidic, seconded by Mr. Gray, to approve the current credit card statement in the amount of \$803.47. Voting: All Yea.

Council reviewed the Water Forgiveness Request Form which listed one resident requesting a one-time calendar year forgiveness of their December bill due to an undetected water leak. Motion was made by Mr. Gray, seconded by Mrs. Lammers, to approve said request. Voting: All Yea.

Village Administrator, Rick Morrison, presented the following report; (1) State made contact regarding the light at the Medical Center that you see when going out of town. AEP put this light up and it is extremely bright and at a bad angle for drivers. The State has said that this is a safety issue however they cannot do anything about it but stated that the village can. Chief Stant has also received complaints about this. It was the consensus of Council to have Mr. Morrison talk to the Medical Center regarding this.

Mr. Brian Miller, Community Center representative, spoke with Council regarding the windows on the South side of the gym. These have been leaking and the Community Center Board would like to replace them as well as the door at the boy's locker room. They have received two quotes. One of the companies will be attending their next meeting to finalize their quote. Mr. Miller asked Council to split the cost of these items from the Community Center Fund with the Arthur-Lugibihl

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Community Center Foundation. Councilwoman, Mrs. Braidic-Community Center Liaison, will attend the Foundations next meeting regarding this project and will report back to Council.

Chief Stant provided quotes for solar powered speed radar signs. The best quote was from Elan City in the amount of \$12,800 for four signs. Council discussed possible sites for the signs and how this would impact issuing speeding tickets. Motion was made by Mrs. Lammers, seconded by Mr. Fricke, to approve the purchase of four solar powered speed radar signs at a cost of \$12,800 from Elan City. Voting: All Yea.

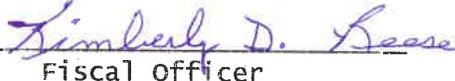
With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned upon a motion by Mr. Gray, seconded by Mrs. Lammers. Voting: All Yea.
