The Pandora Village Council met in Regular Session on Tuesday, May 26, 2026 at 7:00 PM at the Municipal Building, with Mayor, Jeremy Liechty, presiding.

Also in attendance: Chief, Scott Stant /Fiscal Officer, Kimberly Reese/Solicitor, Scott Basinger.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion was made by Mrs. Lammers, seconded by Mr. Gray, to approve the May 12, 2026 Minutes. Voting: All Yea.

Motion was made by Mr. Gray, seconded by Mrs. Braidic, to approve the bills as presented; total non-payroll of \$62,681.23 and payroll of \$28,030.27 for a total of \$90,711.50. Voting: All Yea.

Ordinance No. 623-2026: AN ORDINANCE REPLACING ORDINANCE 621-2025 (FIXING RATES AND CHARGES FOR WATER SERVICE FOR THE VILLAGE OF PANDORA, PUTNAM COUNTY, OHIO, IT'S INHABITANTS AND OTHER USERS) AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT THEREWITH. Motion was made by Mr. Fricke, seconded by Mr. Gray, to adopt Ordinance No. 623-2026 as read, for its third and final reading. Voting: All Yea.

Motion was made by Mrs. Braidic, seconded by Mrs. Lammers, to approve the current credit card statement in the amount of \$707.26. Voting: All Yea.

Fiscal Officer, Kimberly Reese, presented to Council totals for Water Forgiveness Requests received from February 13, 2024 to May 12, 2026. There were 45 requests approved in the amount of \$18,683.87.

Chief Stant discussed with Council that he was working on identifying properties that were in violation of the village's Mowing and Maintenance of Properties Ordinance. There are several properties with tall weeds, grass, piles of sticks and brush. Newsletters will be going out this week with a copy of Ordinance No. 579-2017 addressing mowing and maintenance. Chief Stant will also post a letter on the village's facebook page reminding residents of several different ordinances regarding their properties. After this, letters will be sent out to those residents who are in violation.

Council discussed a concern from a resident regarding parking on the street on Heather Lane. The main concern was large vehicles parking on the curves of the street creating blind spots. After further discussion, it was determined that no village ordinances were being violated and that this was a civil issue with neighbors in this subdivision.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned upon a motion by Mr. Gray, seconded by Ms. Hovest. Voting: All Yea.
