Great News!

After a 16-week Capitol Campaign, the \$350,000 goal for the St. Joseph Building Fund has been reached. Here is the financial road that we traveled:

The down payment on the roof of \$128,000 was paid in February 2026. Of this amount, \$50,000 came from savings and \$78,000 from the general fund.

The next big payment of \$85,262.40 came entirely from the general fund in May of 2026. It was about this time that the Finance Council voted to begin a \$350,000 Capital Campaign to pay for the roof and a new parking lot.

Sixteen weeks later, we have succeeded the \$350,000 goal with an estimated \$331,166.06 raised in cash and six pledges of \$20,700 due over the next five years. Both total \$351,866. The money was raised from contributions from 129 of our 750 families, some families gave more than once, \$2,604 collected in pew envelopes from visitors and \$11,895 online contributions divided \$6,395 from members and \$5,500 from guests. The monies collected included a \$25,000 gift from the Altar/Rosary Society (that's a lot of cinnamon rolls and Christmas bazaars) and \$4,880 of copper redeemed when we replaced the gutters on the church. The current balance of the building fund, as of Sept. 8, 2026, is \$278,747.26. Now we will pay \$174,297 for a new parking lot in September and about \$9,000 in pre-required concrete work. We cannot begin to thank everyone for their generosity and positive thinking in support of these projects. We will continue to accept contributions to the building fund because we know the maintenance on our 100+ year-old church will never end. However, we certainly have made a dent in it.

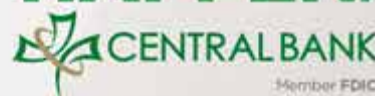

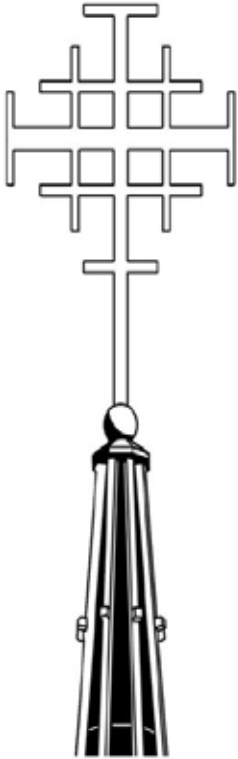

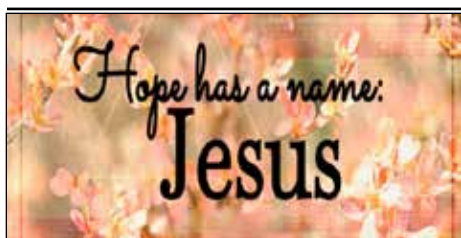

A Note From Fr. Hemann

The readings for this 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time present one of the most sobering and challenging teachings in all of Scripture: the measure with which we measure will be measured back to us.

In our first reading, Sirach puts it bluntly: "Forgive your neighbor's injustice; then when you pray, your own sins will be forgiven." Jesus then amplifies this truth in today's Gospel through the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant. After a servant is forgiven a massive, unpayable debt by his master, he violently chokes a fellow servant over a few coins. Christ makes His point unmistakably clear: if we stubbornly refuse to forgive everybody, neither will our Heavenly Father forgive our sins.

The Thread That Binds Us: St. John of the Cross offers a beautiful image of what this stubbornness does to the soul. He describes a sparrow that desperately wants to soar to the heights but is held captive by a single, thin thread tied around its ankle and secured to the ground. That tiny thread is our stubborn refusal to forgive somebody. No matter how much we pray or fast, holding onto even a single resentment keeps us tethered to the dirt, unable to fly into the freedom of God's grace.

Forgiveness vs. Reconciliation: When facing deep hurts, it is crucial to understand the difference between forgiveness and reconciliation. Forgiveness takes one; reconciliation takes two. There will be times when reconciliation is not possible because of the severe dysfunction or spiritual poverty of another person. You do not have to put yourself in harm's way. However, we are still called to maintain a quiet stance of mercy and forgiveness in our own hearts meaning that if that person were ever to approach us in genuine repentance, our hearts would already be open to forgive them.

Love is a Choice, Not a Feeling: Forgiving someone does not mean we have to be bosom buddies with everybody. We are simply commanded to love them. We must remember that love is not a warm and cozy feeling; love is an act of the will. It means wishing and willing the ultimate good of another person.

When Jesus hung on the cross and was thrust in the side with a lance, He certainly was not experiencing warm, cozy feelings toward the soldiers. In the midst of unimaginable physical agony, He made the radical choice to will their good: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

As we reflect on the unpayable debt God has forgiven us, let us ask ourselves: What thread is tying me down? Let us pray for the grace to cut that thread, to will the good of those who have hurt us, and to measure out the same boundless mercy we hope to receive.

Stewardship REPORT

Stewardship is not optional! "None of us lives as his own master and none of us dies as his own master," says St. Paul. "While we live we are responsible to the Lord, and when we die we die as his servants."
