Settling in Sessions

Our nursery manager will contact you directly in the weeks prior to your start date to discuss your settling in sessions.

Settling in sessions will usually take place within the first few weeks from your start date onwards, and where possible are arranged for days your child would normally be attending so they will enjoy time with the same staff and children they will be with going forward.

There is no charge for settling in sessions.

First visit: Is usually for around 1-hour. This is a private visit with you, your child and a member of staff who will be based with your child. During this session you may stay and play with your child, tell us more about them, and ask any questions you may have at this time.

Further visits: Are for your child to stay and play with us on their own so we can start to build a safe and secure relationship with them. These will be both 2-hour morning or afternoon sessions and also 4-hour sessions to include lunch. The number of settling in sessions will be discussed with you directly and can be flexible based on your child's individual needs.

We aim for these sessions to be as positive as possible for both you and your child and our staff will update you regarding your child's progress in these sessions as required.

Prior to these sessions you will be provided an app login for our system provider 'Famly', we encourage parents to have this set up prior to starting at Tall Trees Kindergarten.

Try and stay as positive and confident as you can during these visits. Children will pick up on the emotions of their parents during this time.
