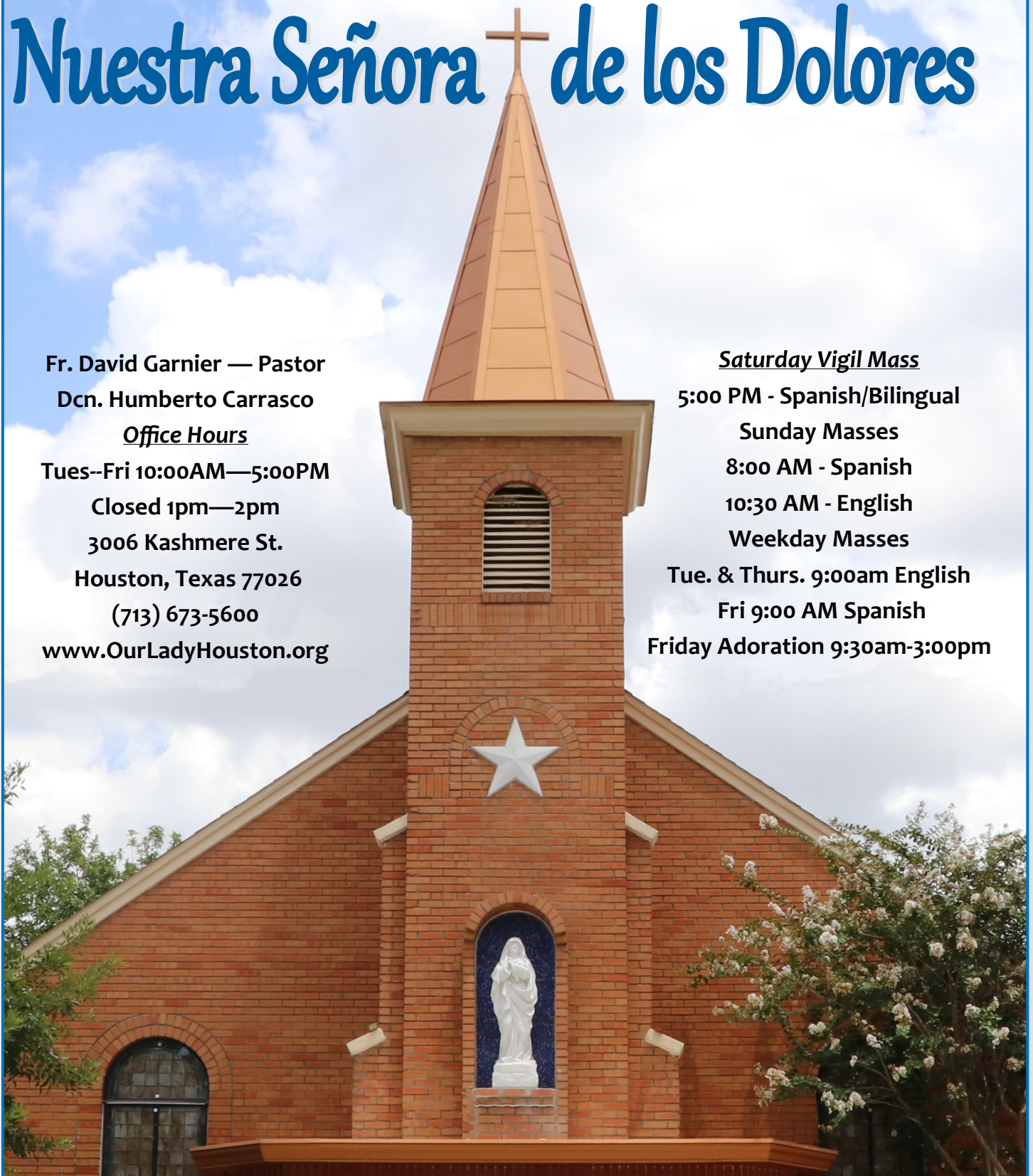

“Rebuild a City”

There doesn't seem to be a period in human history when cities were not destroyed by war. This was the case in ancient Rome, Atlanta during the Civil War, Dresden in World War II, Aleppo in Syria, and cities throughout Ukraine, Israel, and Gaza. The devastation of a city leaves the survivors of the tragedy in desperate straits. This is the situation to which Isaiah speaks in the first reading. His message is one of hope. Jerusalem will be rebuilt; it will flourish once again. God will “spread prosperity over her like a river” (Isaiah 66:12). This will not be accomplished through mere human effort but through the power of God.

The passage from Luke tells us how God will accomplish such a feat. There, we read that Jesus sent seventy-two followers to preach the gospel. The power of God will work through them. We know little about who they were, from which villages they came, or how long they acted as itinerant preachers. They may simply have gone back to their own lives and ministered to their own people. Such information is inconsequential.

What is important is the fact that God works through the followers of Jesus, through you and me. It will be through us that lives are rebuilt, that people thrive again. It will be through us that cities are no longer destroyed by war. Do we believe this? Are we willing to be sent “to every town and place he intended to visit” (Luke 10:1)?

“Reconstruir una ciudad”

No parece haber un período en la historia de la humanidad en el que las ciudades no hayan sido destruidas por la guerra. Este fue el caso de la antigua Roma, Atlanta durante la Guerra Civil, Dresde durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial, Alepo en Siria y ciudades de Ucrania, Israel y Gaza. La devastación de una ciudad deja a los sobrevivientes de la tragedia en una situación desesperada. Esta es la situación a la que se refiere Isaías en la primera lectura. Su mensaje es de esperanza. Jerusalén será reconstruida; florecerá de nuevo. Dios “derramará sobre ella prosperidad como un río” (Isaías 66:12). Esto no se logrará mediante el mero esfuerzo humano, sino mediante el poder de Dios.

El pasaje de Lucas nos dice cómo Dios logrará tal hazaña. Allí leemos que Jesús envió a setenta y dos seguidores a predicar el evangelio. El poder de Dios obrará a través de ellos. Sabemos poco sobre quiénes eran, de qué pueblos provenían o cuánto tiempo actuaron como predicadores itinerantes. Quizás simplemente hayan regresado a sus vidas y hayan ministrado a su propia gente. Esa información es irrelevante.

Lo importante es que Dios obra a través de los seguidores de Jesús, a través de ti y de mí. Será a través de nosotros que las vidas se reconstruyan, que la gente vuelva a prosperar. Será a través de nosotros que las ciudades ya no sean destruidas por la guerra. ¿Creemos esto? ¿Estamos dispuestos a ser enviados «a toda ciudad y lugar que él quería visitar» (Lucas 10:1)?

Será a través de nosotros que las vidas se reconstruyan, que la gente vuelva a prosperar.
