

Week 3: Animals



This week, children played a game of four corners with animals and letters. Children looked at a picture of an animal and had to figure out which letter it started with and go to that corner. They enjoyed being able to get up and move around during this activity.

At camp, children got to use their imagination and create their own fictional animal. This project was called "Animal Mash-up". Children picked two animals and mashed them into one new creature.



Week 4: Plants

This week, children learned all about plants. We discussed the parts of the plant and why they are so important. Group 1 found a plant at camp and created a watercolor painting of this plant.

Group 2 creating Botanical Books. We completed some research with a plant identifying app and learned about some of the plants around camp. Children were then able to draw their plant in their books.
