The Whole Story

I'm stuck in the garden. No, I'm not talking about prepping for a Spring planting. I'm stuck in the Garden of Gethsemane during Jesus' arrest. Armed guards show up and Jesus's disciples jump into the fight. A high priest's slave's ear is slashed off. This is serious stuff. And Jesus puts a stop to the fight with the most preposterous statement, "**Don't you realize** that I could ask the Father for thousands of angels to protect us, and he would send them instantly? But if I did, how would the Scriptures be fulfilled that describe what must happen now?" (Matt 26:53-54)



Huh!?! Jesus could do what? Then why doesn't he? Imagine all the pain and suffering Jesus could have avoided, not just for himself but for so many others. Jesus is crucified. Judas commits suicide. A poor guy loses an ear. The disciples scatter. How many others have been harmed all because Jesus didn't call in his miraculous angel brigade of reinforcements? But Jesus lets the story continue.

In three days the tomb will be empty. The Son of God had died. Everyone witnessed it. Blood mixed with water would pour from his side. There was no mistaking the pain, the brokenness, the loss. On Friday Jesus and his movement was dead. But there was more to the story.

Fifty days later a whole new chapter would start. Jesus had risen from the dead. The stone was rolled away. 500 people witnessed the risen Lord. The resurrected Jesus even makes breakfast for his disciples. Then, after forty days he ascends into heaven and the disciples go into hiding. And when it seems all over, something like a mighty rushing wind bursts in and births the Church. Frightened men and women become emboldened missionaries proclaiming Good News no one would have ever believed... unless it were true. And the story continued.

Maybe I don't realize. I am a man of faith. I dream of all the great and glorious things God could do in and through Tabernacle in our community and world. I pray every day for Revival. I pray for miracles. I pray for healing. Day in and day out I pray that God would send in his miraculous angel brigade of reinforcements to

heal my friends, to end the brokenness, to reveal God's glory, and to cure our community. And as I pray I try so hard to understand why God doesn't send in the angel army. Could there be more to the story?

Its easy to get stuck in the garden. We want the immediate miracle but God is writing a miraculous story. We wonder why God isn't acting when in reality God is continually writing. Maybe there is a story unfolding in our daily lives that we can't see or appreciate right now. We're being asked to stay out of the fight, endure the pain, even grieve the loss all while we move day by day and decision by decision towards the next chapter. What might the next few pages hold if we chose to trust the storyteller and let the story continue?

In April and May we will begin a new message series on the book of Ruth. It is a remarkable story that leads to the birth of David the King and Jesus the Messiah! Yet not once does God speak. Not once does a miracle take place. Not once is tragedy averted. And while Naomi is sure God's fighting against her, in reality God is writing her into the most significant story ever written. Its amazing the story that God is writing even when it seems like God is not at work.

"Don't you realize..." There is so much more to the story. Lets not get stuck in the garden. When its time for the angel army, we can trust that they will be there. Until then, lets walk forward in faith, trusting that God is writing His miraculous story of our redemption through our every moment and minute. We can even read the last chapter now. Its already written and it is amazing! I can't wait to read how God gets us from here to there!

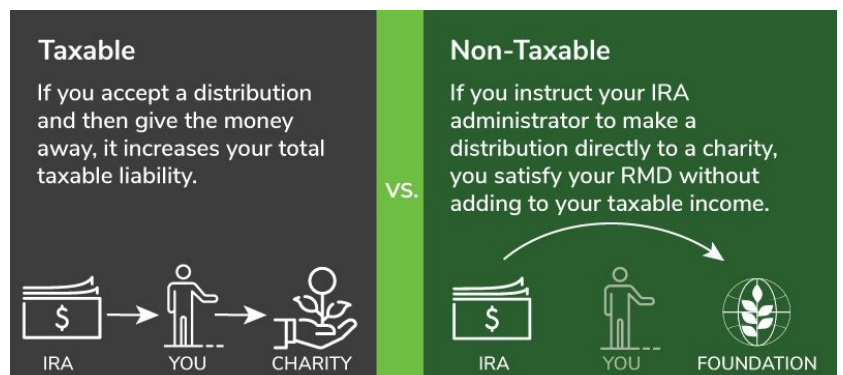
Message from our Finance Ministry Team

Thank you for your ongoing support of Tabernacle Methodist Church. Your prayers, participation, witness, and financial gifts have never been more important as we move forward serving Christ as the "Church for the un-churched." Over the next few months, we will offer alternative giving strategies to consider, in addition to weekly or monthly tithing.

Qualified Charitable Distribution

Have you reached the age where you are taking, or will soon be taking, Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from your IRA? If so, please consider a **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)** to Tabernacle. QCDs allow IRA owners aged 70 1/2 or older to transfer up to \$100,000 each year directly to a charity on a tax-free basis. For IRA owners aged 73 and older, a QCD will count toward the RMD for the year. For most of us, making a QCD allows us to meet the annual RMD requirement, without incurring the taxable income, while making a significant gift to Tabernacle. What a win-win-win opportunity!

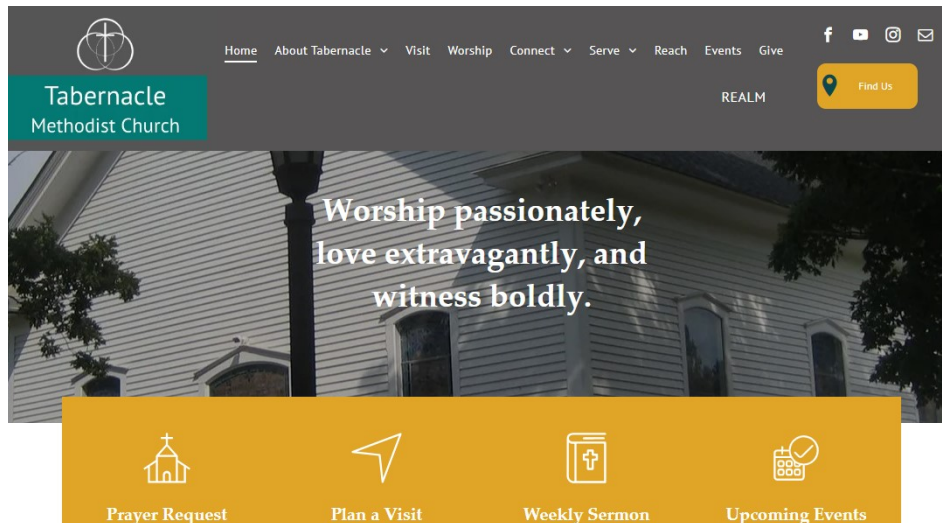
To qualify as a QCD, funds must be paid directly to Tabernacle from the IRA. Additional information is available at www.IRS.gov. Please consult your own tax advisor for guidance prior to implementing a QCD. **Prayerfully consider if a QCD is a way to grow your support of our ministry.**

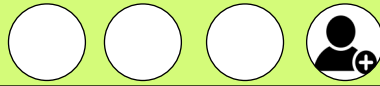

Scholarships for High School Seniors DEADLINE TO APPLY: April 15, 2024

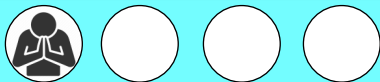
The Methodist Men offer 4 scholarships to graduating seniors from SEHS or members of Tabernacle who may attend other schools.

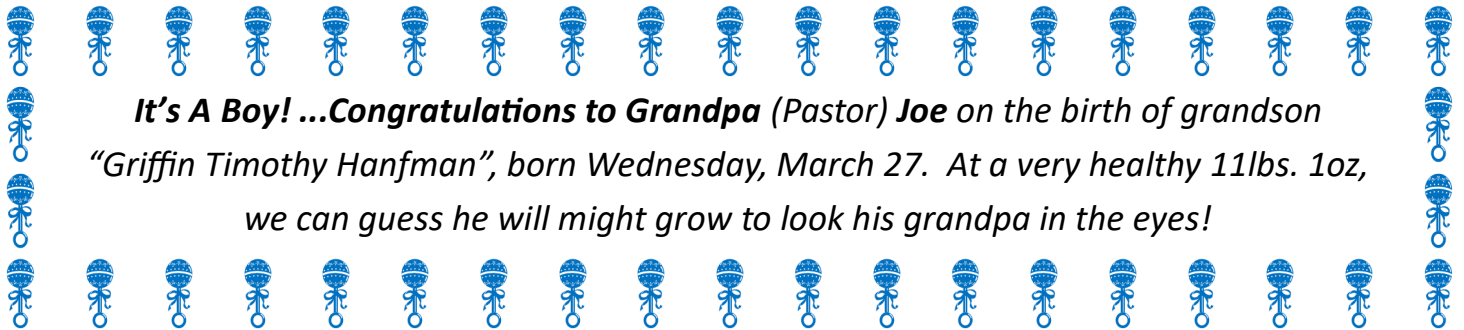
