It's Not About Me!

Murder? Jesus heals a man and people plot to murder him. That's crazy! Jesus heals a man with a deformed hand in the synagogue on the Sabbath and people literally began planning Jesus's murder (Mark 3:1-6). Why? Because Jesus wrecked their religious rituals. We learn early in life that you don't talk politics or religion at the dinner table. Those are



fighting words and religion is a deadly game. Although Jesus could have waited 24 hours, or he could have quietly healed in secret, instead Jesus made a bold statement to prove a critical point. True Religion is not about me! True Religion is always about God and them.

When Jesus proclaims "The Kingdom of God is at hand" Jesus is letting everyone know that the true manner of our worship is being revealed (Mark 1:15). Later, Jesus would famously articulate the two most fundamental elements of pleasing and worshiping God: Love the Lord God with all your heart, soul, and mind. And love your neighbor as yourself. Everything, Jesus said, hangs on those two commands (Matt 22:37-40). So true religion is all about loving God and loving others. Do you notice who is not there? True religion is not about me! True Religion is always about God and them.

John Wesley was a priest in a culture and time where the church had immense influence and power. Yet in the midst of this cultural expectation for proper religion, a large percentage of the population did not attend church and did not have saving faith in Jesus. John Wesley became captivated by the passionate faith and preaching of a handful of priests willing to break ritual and religious standards to share Jesus wherever the people gathered. They preached outside the church in the coal mines, in the town square, out on the hillside. Wherever people could hear, these preachers shared Jesus. The religious establishment reacted harshly. They persecuted, beat, and imprisoned these open-air preachers. Yet people were hearing the Gospel and finding saving faith in Jesus. It was hard to go against his religious expectations but on April 2, 1739, John Wesley joined the movement. He wrote in his journal, "At four in the afternoon I submitted to be more vile, and proclaimed in the highways the glad tidings of salvation." Tabernacle Methodist Church is a direct descendent of this bold choice. John Wesley let his true religion be about God and them.

We live in similarly challenging and changing times. A large percentage of our population does not attend church and does not have saving faith in Jesus. However, open-air preaching no longer reaches the people. Online preaching has only a small impact. The way people are reached with the Good News of Christ today is through intentional friendships. We need to go make friends, real relationships exhibiting trust and affection,

with our unbelieving friends. But then what? For the last 50 years in America, a movement has grown that suggests a radical idea: True Religion isn't about you. (The movie *The Jesus Revolution* depicts the start of this movement.) Church isn't about you. Instead, we are the Church and our church buildings and services are for God and them. The place we worship, like the synagogue where Jesus healed the man's hand, is an opportunity for people to be healed, finding salvation. Church is for the unchurched. True Religion is always about God and them.

In a church for the unchurched, we design what we do and how we do it around the needs and expectations of our unbelieving, unchurched friends. The space, the music, and the sermon are organized so that they bless everyone but make sense to our visiting friends. We could call it intentional hospitality. When I plan to have guests at my house, I clean, shop, and organize a space with my visiting friend in mind. The guest gets the best. They are the center of attention. A church for the unchurched approaches Sunday mornings with the same compassion, hospitality, and love in mind. We practice our true religion by making it about God and them.

It seems wrong to make our church more about the unchurched. We so quickly forget that real church has nothing to do with our rituals or space. Our services are not the church. We, those with saving faith, are the Church. We have Christ and we are the body of Christ. We have our brothers and sisters who pray for us, train and equip us, and serve along side us. We have all we need in those relationships. We are loved by God. So for us, true religion is the practice of loving God and others.

Tabernacle family, I want to place a bold challenge before us. 100 churches close every week in the United States. Average church attendance is down 50% since 2000. The overwhelming majority of church attenders nationwide are over the age of 65. Yet there is a movement of growing churches designed for unbelieving and unchurched friends. It seems absurd. Many will say, "We want our church!" But Tabernacle, can we embrace our heritage and become what John Wesley might call "more vile." Can we practice a religion that isn't about me? Can we choose true religion firmly focused on loving God and loving our neighbors? Can we become a church for the unchurched? —Pastor Matt



Beginning in 2024, Tabernacle has added a new international mission partner. Anup and Darcy Rai and their family have moved to Bangkok, Thailand to share Christ with the people there. Anup sent the update below and I wanted to share it with you. Please pray for this family regularly as they seek to make Jesus known!

From Anup:

Today marks 1 month since we moved to Thailand, so what better time to give a quick ministry update. Please see the pictures below for descriptions.

Where shall I begin? Thailand needs to know about our Lord and Savior. Of course, change is difficult (and has been in some ways for us), and with three children, there is definitely a higher degree of challenges. Also, Bangkok is a vast city, and it is easy to feel insignificant here. Walking around the city, the spiritual needs can be clearly seen and felt clearly, and it is easy to be overwhelmed. Did you know that out of the 71 million people in Thailand, 11 million live in Bangkok, and only around 1 percent are Christians?

What adds to the challenge is that the people of Thailand speak very little to No English. It has been difficult to communicate for regular life things- from getting water and gas for the house to getting a taxi. But we know we are where God has us. At the end of my seminary journey in July, I said, "No more language for at least a while." That is not the case today; I feel motivated to learn Thai- many days, I walk past beggars and people in need, and I want to sit down and share the love of Jesus, but I cannot. I am so ready to speak Thai (I just started language class 2 days ago).

Let me end by sharing this story... I hope it touches your heart as it touched ours. We were walking in the street, looking around, and discussing how Thailand needs to know about Jesus. So, we were talking about how Thailand has less than 1% of Christians. Lucca stops us and looks at Darcy and says: "Mommy, did you know that number just increased when we came here."

That's right, Lucca.

Please pray with us that God will open the eyes of the hearts of the people of Thailand. Blessings to you all.




