Who Do You Serve?

How do I know God's will for my life? For many people, and especially for us as Christ Followers, this is a crucial question. We believe God has a specific plan for our lives and we want to be sure we follow the path he has set for us. I have watched many of my Christian friends through the years wrestle with this as they sought to follow Jesus more closely.

I recently read an article focused on how we determine God's will. While many books have been written and many sermons preached on discerning God's will, this article took a slightly different approach. The author suggested a better question to ask. When Jesus was asked, what is the greatest commandment, he answered "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength." The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these." (Mark 12:30-31) The question the author suggested we ask ourselves to determine God's will is "Who do you serve?" Jesus clearly teaches that our focus as Christ followers should be on loving and worshiping God and loving others. But which others?

Who do you serve? We repeatedly see the command in scripture to care for the widow and the orphan, those who are hungry and thirsty, the prisoner and the foreigner. We also see that Jesus clearly defined His mission as one to seek and save the lost. He was criticized throughout His ministry for hanging out with sinners. After one of these criticisms, Jesus says in Matthew 9:12-13, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners." He healed many of their physical illnesses but even more sought to heal their spiritual sickness. He called us as His disciples to do likewise. We should seek to minister to those who are hungry for food and hungry for God.

Who do we serve as the church? Our first response has to be to turn our focus off of ourselves and toward those who we are called to serve. This is no easy task. We are naturally inclined to seek our own comfort and care. We can easily see church as a club where we are members. As members, we have certain rights, privileges and expectations to be met. We have our rituals and practices that must be followed as we always have, because that is what we know and expect. Because of the connotation of this word, I sometimes struggle with membership as the right description of being a part of the church. One church where I was on staff had a much better term. When someone joined that church, they became a "ministry partner". As it was explained in the class for folks joining, up to that point they had been guests who had experienced the hospitality and service from others. Now they were becoming

a partner who would serve others in the same way. This culture permeated the church and was a primary reason for the significant growth and life change experienced by so many through that church.

What are the opportunities for us at Tabernacle to serve others? Through our Serve Ministry, we have established partnerships with organizations such as Church Under the Bridge and Greensboro Urban Ministry that serve low income and homeless communities throughout Greensboro. We partner with Room at the Inn, which provides care for single moms through pregnancy and childbirth. We have a group that serves families in need of food assistance by partnering with local schools through our backpack ministry. All of these ministries and others offer a hands-on opportunity to serve others locally who have specific, significant needs. We also have international mission partners who share the good news of Jesus with people who have no other way of hearing it.

How do we follow Jesus' lead in serving those far from God? We do what He did. We spend time with them. We get to know them. We focus our attention individually and as a church on welcoming them and creating an environment where they can hear God's truth and respond to it. We give up what we want for what they need. We answer the question of "who do I serve?" with the names of folks in my relational circle who don't know the saving grace of Jesus Christ. Then we figure out how God has gifted us and where these gifts can be used to serve others. We need to ask ourselves, who am I passionate about serving? And how does my service show God's love to them?

During this season of Lent, we consider what Jesus did for us through His death and resurrection. We will celebrate Easter, when Jesus sacrificed everything to bring victory over sin and death. He served all of humanity as only God in human form could. Our eternal destiny has been changed because of His death and resurrection. And he calls us to take up our cross and follow Him. As you prepare to celebrate, consider those in your relational circle who don't know or don't accept the freely offered grace that comes through Jesus. How can you serve them? Pray for those in your circle who don't know the saving grace of Christ and consider how you can show them God's love for them. As we have experienced God's love, serve others by sharing that same love.




