Put It All Together

"What good is it, dear brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but don't show it by your actions? Can that kind of faith save anyone? ... So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless." James 2:14, 17 (NLT)

James doesn't mince words. He basically says, "If you say you believe it, prove it." It's like when someone tells you they've started a diet while holding a Krispy Kreme doughnut or bag of

Doritos in both hands. I've been there. I've even told myself, "This one doesn't count if I eat it standing up." (That's not in the Bible, by the way.) James would probably raise an eyebrow and say, "You can't just say you believe in healthy living—you've got to put down the Doritos." In other words, belief isn't just what we say; it's what we live. Our faith must have feet.

James reminds us that faith isn't an accessory—it's an action. It's not a badge we wear on Sunday mornings; it's the way we walk through every day of the week. Faith has feet. It moves. It serves. It gives. It shows up.

John Wesley put it this way: "Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can."

John Wesley and the early Methodists were people who took James seriously. As members of Tabernacle Methodist Church, we commit to five practices that turn belief into action: our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness. These are not just nice words for a membership form. They are the shape of a living, breathing, active faith.


Our Prayers



Our Gifts

This includes our finances, but it's about so much more. Our "gifts" are all the resources God has entrusted to us: our time, our talents, our creativity, our compassion. Giving changes us. It loosens the grip that fear and selfishness can have on our hearts. It reminds us that everything we have is a gift from God in the first place. Its not optional or extra, generous giving is faithful living.

Our Service

Faith is love made visible through action. When Jesus washed the disciples' feet, He gave us the perfect picture of what service looks like—not glamorous, not convenient, but deeply holy. When we serve others, we're serving Christ and serving on behalf of Christ. Our serving isn't meant to change the world. Our serving sets the table so that Jesus can savior our neighbors.

Our Witness

You may not think of yourself as an evangelist, but every day your life tells a story about what—and who—you believe in. You witness through your words, yes, but also through your kindness, your integrity, your patience, and your hope. The way you treat people at work, at school, or in the grocery store—those moments preach louder than any sermon I can give.

Putting It All Together

When we put these five commitments—our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness—into motion, we become Christ's love, truth and grace in action. We move from being consumers of faith to being contributors to God's kingdom. James would say, "Now that's faith that's alive."

Sometimes we think we need a special calling or a big platform to make a difference, but most of the time, it's the daily acts of sacrificial faith that shape eternity. A whispered prayer. A steady presence. A generous gift. A servant's hand. A kind word that points someone toward Jesus. It's the ordinary, everyday choices of faithful people that God uses to do extraordinary things.

John Wesley once wrote, "The gospel of Christ knows of no religion but social; no holiness but social holiness." In other words, faith is not a private possession—it's a public expression. It's how we live together, love together, and serve together. It's how the world sees Christ in us.

Lets not just talk about what we believe. Let's live it. Let's put our faith into action. Let's be a church that doesn't just gather inside these walls—but goes out into the world with the hands, feet, and heart of Jesus.

And maybe, just maybe, if James were to peek into Tabernacle on a Sunday morning and follow us around during the week, he might smile and say, "That's what I was talking about"

On Saturday, October 25th, 17 folks from Tabernacle collected Food for the Greensboro Urban Ministry Food Pantry at the Food Lion across the street. These collections are held twice a year and are one of the main ways the Food Pantry is stocked. On that day, we collected 2025 lbs. of food and \$149. The food drive is citywide at Walmart and Food Lion stores and the entire drive collected 33,000 lbs. of food. The Greensboro Urban Ministry Food Pantry feeds thousands of families each year. 




