

Imagine the Joy!

"Well done, good and faithful servant. Enter into the joy of your Master." (Matthew 25:23)

If you could choose the words that would sum up your life, what would they be? Some people long to be remembered as successful, kind, generous, or adventurous. But as followers of Jesus, the words we most want to hear are the ones spoken by the Master in the Parable of the Talents: "Well done, good and faithful servant."

In that story, the master entrusts his servants with different amounts of



The third servant has a different approach. Out of fear, he buries the money. He preserves it, but he doesn't put it to use. And when the master returns, instead of hearing, "Well done," he hears only disappointment.

The heart of the parable is clear: God has entrusted every one of us with gifts, time, opportunities, and resources. He expects us to do something with them. Faithfulness is not about preserving what we've been given; it's about investing it for the Kingdom.

This fall, our church has been exploring what it means to live a FIT Lifestyle — Faithful, Intentional, and Teachable. This parable shows us what that looks like in action.


- Faithful: The servants who were commended didn't waste time, hide what they had, or make excuses. They showed that they were loyal, dependable and true.
- Intentional: They didn't take the easy path and preserve what they had been given. They pressed on , they were proactive and purposeful, knowing their master's return was certain.
- Teachable: They knew what their master desired and they sought to please him. They risked their comfort and sought to grow what they were given for their master's sake.

Living FIT means we don't coast through our spiritual lives or bury our opportunities in fear. We lean into what God has entrusted, trusting that even small steps of faith can multiply into something greater.

At Tabernacle, we have pledged ourselves to a set of membership vows that help us stay FIT and faithful: our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. These vows aren't just formalities; they are tools God uses to shape us into faithful servants.

- Prayers: Am I praying regularly, not just for my own needs, but for others, for the church, and for the Kingdom?
 Prayer is one of the simplest but most powerful ways to invest the talents God has given me.
- Presence: Am I showing up in worship, in small groups, in the life of the church? My presence strengthens the body of Christ in ways I may not even realize.
- Gifts: Am I sharing generously from what God has entrusted to me, or am I holding back out of fear? Giving is one of the clearest ways we demonstrate trust in our Master.
- Service: Am I offering my time and abilities to build up others, or am I waiting for someone else to step in?
 Serving multiplies blessing, both for others and for us.
- Witness: Am I speaking about my faith and inviting others into it, or am I keeping silent? A buried witness is like a buried talent it produces nothing.

These five commitments are the everyday opportunities where faithfulness gets tested and proven. They give us the chance to share in the things that bring joy to Jesus. Notice the reward for faithful servants: joy. "Enter into the joy of your Master," the master says.

Faithfulness is not drudgery. It doesn't mean endless duty or grim determination. It means joy. When we live faithfully, intentionally, and teachably — when we keep our vows and invest our talents — we experience the joy of partnering with God in His work.

And one day, when Christ returns, that joy will be made complete.

So let's pause and ask ourselves: Am I burying what God has entrusted to me, or am I investing it? Am I living FIT — faithful, intentional, teachable — or am I settling for safe and comfortable?

The Master has given us much. And if we live for Him, one day we will hear the words that matter most: "Well done, good and faithful servant. Enter into the joy of your Master."
