No Matter What!

The Sunday before last, we wrapped up our Summer series on the Psalms. We have thoroughly enjoyed preaching these messages as we opened up some of the different ways the Psalmists expressed their prayers to God. We explored how the Psalms give voice to our choice to delight in the law of the Lord. We looked at Psalms of worship and praise, expressions of faithful witness and offerings of thanksgiving for God's everlasting provision. We also heard voices confessing and repenting of sin and times when the writer called for divine judgment against an enemy. Throughout the Psalms, we see the raw emotions of the writers poured out to the Lord. We see a picture of God who allows us to express our real, raw, true feelings in the midst of our trials, knowing that He will meet us wherever we are.

We see repeatedly in the Psalms that to know God, we are to love and seek to follow God's good and perfect law. And we see the many expressions of the different ways the Psalmists both strive and struggle to do that. But what we see time and again is a willingness to turn to God in every circumstance, knowing that our God is always there, no matter what.


One of my favorite Psalms that we didn't discuss during this series is Psalm 116. I first became familiar with it early in my career as a Pastor when I visited a woman in the hospital. She told me it was her favorite Psalm and asked me to read it to her. Listen to how it starts:

- 1 I love the Lord, for he heard my voice; he heard my cry for mercy.
- 2 Because he turned his ear to me, I will call on him as long as I live.
- 3 The cords of death entangled me, the anguish of the grave came over me; I was overcome by distress and sorrow.
- 4 Then I called on the name of the Lord: "Lord, save me!"

- 5 The Lord is gracious and righteous; our God is full of compassion.
- 6 The Lord protects the unwary; when I was brought low, he saved me.

The woman I visited went home to the Lord a little over a week later. We read this Psalm at her funeral. I have since used it a number of times in similar circumstances, including recently when I visited a dear friend and mentor prior to his passing. I read it to him in the hospital and again to his family during his last day in hospice. It always reminds me that our God meets us in the midst of whatever we go through, including our final days on earth.

As I thought of a God who allows us to turn to him in all circumstances, I was reminded of something my daughter wrote a few years ago. I love the way she sees this truth through the prayers of a child. I leave you with this reminder in her words.

Laura writes:

"Every night as I'm tucking my baby girl into bed, we try to pray together. She likes to pray first and have me pray second.

Tonight, as we settled in to say our prayers, she earnestly looked up at me and asked: "Mommy, can you pray the exact same thing I pray tonight in case God doesn't hear me?" Her beautiful blue eyes searched mine for an answer, and I confidently assured her that God always hears her and always loves her. She smiled with relief and repeated after me: "No matter what!"

As I snuggled next to her in the quiet several minutes later, the impact of my own words hit me. How often do I feel like God doesn't hear me or doesn't actually care? How many times in this season of my life have I wanted to scream towards Heaven just to feel heard? But my heart knew the answer to my little one's concern without any hesitation: He always hears you. He always loves you. No matter what.

There are so many things about God that I will never fully understand. But not this. I know this. And now I'm realizing that maybe I needed that reminder more than my 4 year old did. Maybe you do, too. So, my friend, may I encourage you: He hears you and He loves you, no matter what."




